The Hussein Family - Update

The Hussein family from Syria, sponsored and supported by St. Andrews - a project joined, and supported financially, by many in St. David's, has now completed their first year in Canada. Other than the family allowances that every family receives for their children, the one year of financial support from the Federal Government has ended and the relevant support of that kind now comes from the government of this province. It has been a busy and eventful year for the family and for many in both congregations. St. Andrew's continues to help as appropriate, and the family can continue to live in the apartment occupied since their arrival. When the family arrived, the eldest boy, Mohammad, qualified for kindergarten, moving up to grade 1 in September when his brother, Yassine, entered kindergarten, both at Rennies River Elementary.

The birth of Hassan on November 6 has to be the most important event in their Canadian lives so far. Hassan is now a strapping boy of over 6kg! During her pregnancy Bahijeh, the mother, had dialysis six times a week. That involved a rotation of drivers from both congregations including – from St. David's - Pam Bruce, Janet Calver, Penny Gillies, Kathy McKay, Christine and John McLean and Tanya Shalaby. Elke and I co-ordinated much of that as well as many appointments at doctors and dentists for all the family. Others were much engaged in a variety of other ways, including shopping and child-minding.

The development of language skills in English remains important. Mostafa, the father, Mohammad and Yassine have made progress. Dini den Otter was much involved as liaison and helper and now Jeanette Laaning, a retired teacher, has volunteered language lessons for Bahijeh twice a week or when Bahijeh has been up to it. All who visit and/or drive have used the opportunity to support this through basic conversation.

Mostafa now owns a car and has a cleaning job on Saturdays and Sundays. The family's independence is increasing. While some Saturday journeys from dialysis have continued to be provided by volunteers, transport coordination is no longer needed, and Elke and I have ended our formal involvement. We keep in touch, and have responded willingly when called on for help, as we are from time to time.

This project has been greatly assisted by several speakers of Arabic, all graduate students, acting as interpreters and communicators in various ways, not least in emergencies. There has been some financial recognition of this. St. Andrew's is considering another sponsorship through the Presbyterian Church in Canada, as was the case for the Husseins.February 26 th, 2017

St. David's is a lively congregation of people from many backgrounds, young and old, from Newfoundland, from mainland Canada and other places around the world. A very old congregation, begun in 1775 as "The Dissenting Church of Christ at St. John's", it became part of the Presbyterian Church in Canada in 1938, and took the name St. David's in 1959.

Our historic roots nourish a mission-minded, scripture based church which seeks to express the faith for the modern day. Our aim is to foster a welcoming, loving and joyous spiritual community where all worshippers feel comfort and enjoyment.


