## Growth Beyond the Community

Juan Ramirez Cardon, a farmer in Guatemala, was very reliant on the use of costly fertilizers to ensure he could grow enough food for his family.

But the expense soon became more than he could bear. Juan could see no alternative and feared for his family's future.

With the goal of helping farmers who are struggling to provide food for their families, Presbyterian World Service & Development partners started agro-ecology groups in Juan's community to teach environmentally sustainable farming methods that increase yields and improve nutrition.

Training in crop diversification and grafting fruit trees helped Juan transform his plot into nourishment for his family — without chemical fertilizers.

But what Juan is most proud of is being able to share what he's learned far beyond his own farm. Part of being in the group meant promoting

soil-healthy farming in other communities — and ensuring vulnerable families have abundant food for the long-term.

This Lenten season, let us faithfully respond to God's call to serve those in need and create brighter futures for generations of farming families in Guatemala.
