In-person Church Services Are Back

St. David's is again having in-person services. In Alert Level 2 we are able to have a worship service that will be both in-person and live-streamed at 11:00 AM on Sundays. Please keep in mind that under the latest restrictions, we are allowed a maximum of **50 people** in our sanctuary. For those members of St. David's who are unable to participate in virtual worship for one reason or another, we would like to invite you to attend in person when you are comfortable doing so. If you are able to participate with us virtually over Zoom or YouTube live, please join us that way.

Getting the Service and Bulletin using our website

This bulletin and the Sunday service are placed on our website as soon as the Rollmann family get Monica's email. The website is **stdavids.nf.ca** and if you type this in as your search, our website will be right there. At the top of the main page is a "Sunday Service" which will take you to this week's service link and bulletin. Since our Sunday services are now live-streamed, the link is already posted so people can experience the Sunday service at home live beginning at 11 am on Sunday. If you click on Video Service for April 18th you will see the screen and the note: live in "a number" of hours. After the fact, you can see the YouTube video of the service. If you would like to catch up on previous services all are available, simply scroll through the services and choose the Sunday service or bulletin that you would like to see or read.

News from the Pews

Special Plaque

Our Sanctuary is full of commemorative windows, plaques, banners and other remembrances of occasions and families that hold a special spot in the history and life of our congregation. Now you can't miss some of these memorials, but others – well you might have to walk around a bit and take a closer look. The plaque we're going to talk about today, hangs on the east wall where the choir sits. (It's right next to the door David sometimes uses to go back and forth to his office.)

The inscription on the plaque says that the plaque "...was donated to St. David's as an act of remembrance for Fred Chancey, a humble friend and beloved, tireless member and elder of this congregation." Many of us have fond memories of Fred. He was on Session when I became an elder and he was always an inspiration and mentor – not only to me but to all of us. It's fitting that we have this remembrance of him - for what he stood for and for what he did for our Church.

The design on the plaque is very familiar as well. Over the years, most of the special wood-working in St. David's has been done by Angus Bruneau – he just had a special talent – so of course I had to ask Steve Bruneau if he could shed some light on the design behind the plaque. Steve explained that Angus built the plaque in 2009. The same company that does the leaves for the Memorial Tree, did the laser printing of the writing on the plaque. But it was Angus who did the carving and actual colour inking on the plaque. The plaque is a model of the Queen's Road Church interior.

So I encourage you to take a walk through our Church and find this special plaque – a remembrance of Fred Chancey and a testament to the care and attention Angus gave to each piece of his work.

The inscription reads:

“The oak banner above the cross was designed and made by Dr. Angus A. Bruneau and donated to St. David’s Church as an act of remembrance for Fred Chancey, a humble friend and beloved, tireless member and elder of this congregation.

It was inspired by a display of the same scripture from Psalm 29: 2 that once adorned an arch in the Queen’s Road Church, the former home of this congregation.

In this year, the fiftieth anniversary of the move to St. David’s from Queen’s Road, the congregation may again be inspired by the prominent display of this scripture that had long been a part of our tradition.


The congregation accepted this gift with great thanks and dedicated it to the glory of God on the fifth day of April in the year 2009.”

Way back when:

Last week the question was: On August 1, 1894, the church had its Annual Picnic. Where and how people get there?

The answer is: The picnic was held in Manuels and most people took the train. Tickets for the train and tea cost ninety cents. About 120 children took part in cricket, football (soccer), made rings for singing and had various races. The train back to town left at 8:20 pm and arrived back at the Depot (at the foot of Signal Hill) 50 minutes later after a stop at the Ropewalk crossing. The train ran along what is now Empire Ave.

This week the question is: On August 2, 1894, the day after the successful picnic. What happened?

Recent History:

Last week the question was: What was the impact on the congregation of the old (Queen's Road) and new (Elizabeth Ave.) church's roofs?

The answer is: In the Queen's Road Church, the roof had leaks. On rainy days, the organist had to have someone hold an umbrella over her head while she played and some of the organ pipes gurgled. The rest of the

congregation remained relatively dry! In the new church on Elizabeth Ave. the first roof was metal. When it was hot, the condensation caused “rain” and on rainy days it was extremely difficult to hear the softly-spoken minister preach his sermons.

This week the question is: What was the “church hall” in the new Elizabeth Ave. church?
