Saturday, July 17 We pray for congregations as they plan Vacation Bible Schools either in person or online this summer.


Message from the Minister:

In the last few weeks, Oliver has started going to daycare two days a week. The province of Newfoundland has just started a provincial subsidy program for daycares, meaning that full-day childcare now costs \$25 a day for most places. This is great news for our province, since it is a real struggle for low-income families to break free of the poverty cycle when child care costs more than can be made at a minimum wage job. Subsidized child care is a real benefit to our province!

On a more personal note, it has been a real benefit for us, too. Oliver is almost four, full of energy, and very social. This chance to meet and play with other kids his age is exactly what he needs, and the physical exercise of a full day of running, chasing, and playing doesn't hurt either. On Tuesday, I went to pick him up and, since the daycare is close to our house, we walked home together. His walking pace after a day of daycare was... slow. I think we took about four breaks on a walk that would have taken me less than ten minutes. But through it all, when I asked Oliver if he was feeling tired, he would confidently respond that he wasn't at all tired or sleepy, and we would walk another few steps before grinding to a halt again. How often do we pretend we've got more in our "fuel tank" than we really do? How often do you try to hide your tiredness, your sadness, or your loneliness? We think that being worn thin is a sign of weakness, or that telling someone else when we are feeling low means we are a complainer. But scripture is full of stories of God choosing the worn-out and loving those who are suffering. The disciples were too tired to stay awake while Jesus prayed, Mary met the risen Lord when she was brokenly mourning him at his grave, the sick and the unclean were never turned away or scorned by Jesus like the Pharisees were.

Sometimes, it's OK to be tired. It's ok to need a rest or a listening ear. Weakness is something we can embrace, because we know that when we are weak, God is strong. So may you show your weakness and tiredness to God this week, may you sit on the grass with him and tell him about your day. For God will wait with you and hear you, God will walk with you at

whatever pace you can go, and if you are too weak to go on, God's strength is enough to carry you through. We can admit our weakness with God. That's Good News for us today. Hallelujah, and Amen.

I know many of us have very fond memories of Millie and Harold. They hold a very special place in our hearts and in the history of our Church. We hope you enjoy these special moments from their wedding, July 19, 1959.
