Message From the Minister



This Friday, Oliver had his first of four days of Kinderstart! The other three days are spread out later in the school year, but this was, officially, his first day of real school. As you can tell from the picture, he was pretty excited.

These days, there's always a little apprehension that goes with this kind of thing: with COVID, you never know what will be different or even cancelled. It's hard to know what to expect these days, a reality I reflected on as I was trying to explain to Oliver what he could expect at his first class. Would they have to wear masks? Would the kinderStart kids have to stay distanced? And Oliver's burning question: Would they have snacks?

When I read through the Bible, I'm often struck by how unexpected God's plans can be for the people in them. Jesus' entry to Jerusalem on a humble donkey wasn't expected, Moses spent an afternoon talking to a bush in his pasture, and the early church had

to welcome Saul the Christian-killer into their midst as the newly-converted Apostle Paul.

Trusting in God means that we don't need to be afraid when we're trying new things. We never need to let uncertainty or fear keep us from doing new things, because God will be with us no matter what. As we settle into a "new normal", it's good to know that God's will be with us in whatever new experiences we are facing. That's Good News for all of us!

In-person Church Services start February 13th

St. David's will return to in-person services this Sunday February 13th. We will also stream the service live and place it on YouTube for later viewing. We are following the guidance of Public Health and our own Covid-19 Best Practices Committee (CBPC). Below is their direction:

Services will continue in a hybrid (in-person and virtual) format. You will not need to complete an assessment form. If we have checked your VaxPass, we will not need to do so again. If you have not had your VaxPass verified, we will need to verify it. Mandatory indoor masking is required at all times for everyone over the age of five, children four years and under are exempt from masking. Please adhere to Public Health guidelines on isolation when feeling sick, symptomatic, or if you have had an exposure to COVID. Please maintain physical distancing when in church.

Getting the Service and Bulletin using our website

This bulletin is placed on our website as soon as the Rollmann family receives a copy on Friday morning. The website is **stdavids.nf.ca** and if you type this in as your search, our website will be right there. At the top of the main page is a "Sunday Service" which will take you to this week's service link and bulletin. Since our Sunday services are now live-streamed, the link is already posted so people can experience the Sunday service at home live beginning at 11 am on Sunday. If you click on Video Service for Feb 13th you will see the screen and the note: live in "a number" of hours. After the fact, you can see the YouTube video of the service. If you would like to catch up

on previous services all are available, simply scroll through the services and choose the Sunday service or bulletin that you would like to see or read.

J.C. Jacob

The sympathy of the congregation goes out to the family of Dr. J.C. Jacob (JC), who passed away on February 2, 2022, in India, after a brief illness. Dr. Jacob was born in India in 1934 and went on to graduate from the Christian Medical College (CMC). His professional life eventually brought him to Montreal where he would meet his future wife, Mary Buell. In 1968, he and his wife settled in St. John's and he became a highly respected neurologist and Clinical Professor of Medicine. After his retirement, he and Mary stayed in Newfoundland, but upon Mary's passing, he returned to India and lived in Bangalore, near his siblings. Both Mary and JC were great supporters of their Church – St. Andrew's – and JC especially loved music and even sang in the Church choir. A great friend to many here at St. David's, he will be missed.

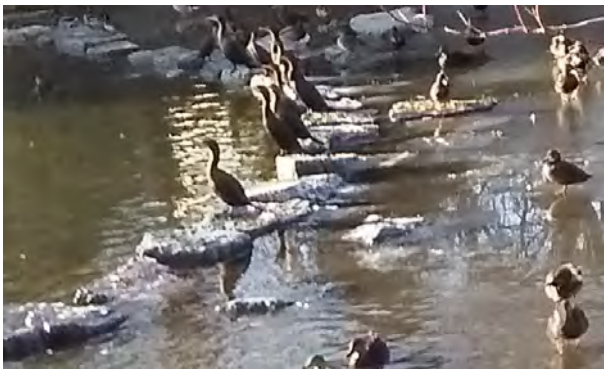
Out-and-About (Janet and Brian)
