Message From the Minister



Many of you have likely noticed something new on my face the last few weeks. I've joined the glasses-wearing team! Maybe it's a product of getting (a little) older, but when I went in for my first eye exam of my adult life, I walked out with a prescription for glasses. My vision isn't very bad; I learned I

mostly suffer from minor astigmatism in my right eye that makes things like small text a little hard to focus on. The effect was barely noticeable, but it was enough to encourage me to use my insurance coverage and get an exam.

I won't soon forget the feeling of surprise when the optometrist started fiddling with the lenses on the testing machine. Watching the smallest letters suddenly sharpen into focus, I realized what I'd been missing! It was incredible to me that the difference was so noticeable, since I had barely noticed the blurriness beforehand.

I've since learned that there's nothing like wearing glasses to teach you how much you need glasses. Minor as my prescription is, taking my glasses off makes me rub my eyes and strain as I realize just how blurry everything is to my unassisted vision! How could I have barely noticed this problem before!?

*Your word is a lamp for my feet,
a light on my path.*

(Psalm 119:105)

We are very good at "normalizing" problems. My eyes can constantly flex to compensate for my vision, and my brain can convince itself that things looking a little blurry is normal. If I don't wear my glasses for a while, I slowly stop noticing the problem.

Sin can enter our life in much the same way. If we never open ourselves to correction, if we never read scripture and ask "What do I need to learn from this", if we never pray and ask "God, reveal to me how I have hurt my neighbours this week", if we never consider ourselves as sinners in need of a new heart, we can normalize our own lives.

May God correct us where we do not see things clearly this week. May we know our own shortcomings and ask God to help us overcome them. May we open ourselves to the possibility that we need help, rather than refusing to accept that there is a problem. Amen.

If you click on Video Service for April 24th you will see the screen and the note: live in “a number” of hours. After the fact, you can see the YouTube video of the service. If you would like to catch up on previous services all are available, simply scroll through the services and choose the Sunday service or bulletin that you would like to see or read.

Bridges to Hope

Ever wonder what goes in a Bridges To Hope hamper?

For your information, listed below are the contents of a **SMALL** hamper which is meant to provide 2-3 days food for 1-2 people. They also distribute Medium and Large hampers which contain basically the same items, but in larger quantities. School kits and other extra items are added as required and when available. Personal care items - shampoo, toothpaste, deodorant, etc. are very much in demand as well.

Using this as a guide, next time you're grocery shopping, why not add one or two non-perishable items to place on the food trolley at St. David's. If you're not back to Church on a regular basis yet, food can always be dropped off at the Church Office. As always too, cash or gift cards are helpful and greatly appreciated.

Regular Food Hamper (1-2 people; 2-3 days food)

Milk - canned evaporated - 1	Beans, canned - 1
Soup - Frozen homemade - 1 per person OR Canned - 2 small or 1 large	Dry Pasta/Rice - 1 package
Meat - Fresh/frozen - 1 OR Canned - 1	Canned pasta - Beefaroni/Ravioli, etc. - 1
Crackers - 1 sleeve saltines OR 1 box other	Pasta Sauce - 1
Cookies/Snacks- 1 box cookies OR granola bars	Cereal - 1 regular package
Fresh vegetables -1 bag (potatoes, carrots, onion, turnip)	Vegetables - canned - 2
Kraft Dinner – 1	Juice - 1 Litre (or equivalent)
Fruit - fresh - 4 per person OR canned – 1	Eggs - 1/3 carton (4 eggs)
Bread – 1	Margarine - 1 (1/2 cup block)
Tea/Coffee-1 portion (10-12 teabags, 1 cup coffee)	
Sugar - 1 portion (1 cup)	

** Extra items, such as Noodles, Hamburger Helper, Scalloped Potatoes, Rice, Toilet Tissue, Laundry detergent, etc. are included as available.

In recent weeks, there has been a noticeable increase in new clients at Bridges To Hope, made up mainly of working people and international students. There has also been an increase in the number of hampers being prepared for delivery to seniors who cannot leave their home due to illness, transportation barriers, impaired mobility, and other challenges.

The demand for assistance does not diminish! Now, more than ever, your help is needed!

Now that we can worship in person, please remember to bring non-perishable food items to church and place them on the Food Trolley which will be at the entrance to the Sanctuary.

We will continue to print in our bulletin weekly “specials” from the various flyers of grocery/personal care items which are always in demand and useful to BTH clients.

If you wish, items can be dropped off at the church during the week; there is generally someone there, Tuesday to Friday, 10:00 AM. to 2:00 P. M.
