Thursday, June 23 We pray for survivors of conversion therapy who are struggling to overcome the shame and trauma caused by interventions that sought to change their sexual orientation or gender identity. May God's comfort and grace surround them and help them to access supports for healing.

Friday, June 24 We pray for interim moderators and search committees as they work to assist congregations in calling a new minister.

Saturday, June 25 We pray for the members and work of the Ecumenical and Interfaith Relations Committee.

Message from the Minister:

This week has been a hard week for me. No, it's no grief connected to Father's Day, my parents are both healthy and happy. This is fresh; on Tuesday morning our cat Moses died of a heart attack at only 10 years old. His hypertension predisposed him, but he was medicated for that and showed no signs of discomfort until Monday evening. We were, and are, devastated.

The thing about losing a pet is that you don't just miss them once, you miss them a thousand times. You miss them when you come in the door, when you lie down, when you look around the room. You miss them when you see your other animals looking for them, when you open their favorite window on a sunny day, and when you open a can of tuna. Grief is death by a thousand cuts.

It can also be lonely; it's so easy for us to internalize the message that we should be able to "move on", that though our tears may last for the night they should really be gone by the morning. In the case of a pet, you wonder if people won't understand the magnitude of the loss, and if you will look silly for still crying long after their death. But that isn't how grief works. So this Father's day, my thoughts are with all of those who are grieving the loss of their dads. Whether it was recent or long ago, loss can still cut. We live in a broken world crying out for redemption, and it is OK to be sad, to weep, and to mourn.

May we be a people who leave space for those who mourn, even on our days of celebration. May we recognize the heartache that days of celebration can bring. May this church be a place where we can weep, where grief can be shared, and where the promise that death will be no more is boldly proclaimed. And although I know that's really good news, I need to stop writing now. I have to go find a tissue.

The 2022 Budget was approved at the ACM and contained both high-level and details of our revenues and expenses. We are projecting another deficit budget, therefore I will report on our financial status or highlight extraordinary items.

At the ACM it was proposed that PAD donations be increased by 5% to help cover this year's deficit. While a letter will be going out to those who contribute via the PAD, I'd also like to encourage those who donate using church envelopes on Sundays or by e-transfers to increase their donations as they are able to do so.
