
Thursday, June 9 We give thanks for the members of committees of the General Assembly and for their leadership in the ministry and mission of the church.

Message from the Minister:

On a nice day this past week, Michelle and I took Orson to Topsail beach. It was surprisingly our first visit to that beach, and we had a great time skipping stones, digging in the sand, and to the delight of Orson, I spent some time dragging the biggest rocks I could find around so he would have a place to stand in the waves. He loved standing on a big rock and watching the water roll in around him, although if the wave was especially large, Orson would look back to me and call me over to stand next to him for added security.



"Do not let the floodwaters engulf me or the depths swallow me up or the pit close its mouth over me." (Psalm 69:15)

One picture I took of Orson was right at the perfect moment, as the water had rushed all the way in and it looked like he was perched on a single rock out in the middle of the water. I sent that picture to my family back in Ontario, and joked that he was stuck in the open ocean before sending the second picture when the wave had receded again. The floodwaters were not so deep as they appeared, the danger was less than it seemed in the first picture, and even less than Orson's occasional panicked demand for Daddy to come stand with him would imply.

How often we act that same way! We see the floodwaters all around us, we see danger all around, and we worry. But all throughout scripture, God leads his people through dangers they never imagined. God saves Joseph from slavery, Noah from the flood, the Israelites out of slavery, the life-long sick are healed, the isolated are called, and even the dead are raised to new life. The waters may swirl and churn around us, but God is faithful.

So if you find yourself on a rock, looking around and worrying, have faith. The waters will recede, God has not abandoned you. We can face the rushing waves with confidence. If we learn to trust instead of worrying, we can even find joy and excitement in the crash of the waves and in the unexpected changes to our landscape that each new wave of challenges brings.

May we trust in God as the waves crash, as they pull back and reshape the land around us with their passing. For the floodwaters will not engulf us, the depths will not swallow us up, the pit will not close its mouth around us. What Good News that is for us today!
