## **Mission Moment – Sunday, July 24th**

In Afghanistan, Samaaneh was born with hemiplegia, a form of muscle paralysis that affects one side of the body. Samaaneh's father worked as a teacher and made enough money to support his wife and three children, and also pay for Samaaneh's physiotherapy. After the Taliban took control of Afghanistan, the family fled to Pakistan. While they were able to find refuge in a cramped one-bedroom house, Samaaneh's father couldn't find work, and the family had very little access to financial resources. **Through Presbyterian World Service & Development, in collaboration with ACT Alliance, Samaaneh's family received cash assistance to help with purchasing essential items.** Samaaneh's father has used some of the money to arrange for his daughter to have physiotherapy as well.

## Message from the Minister:

I was flying a kite out on middle cove beach. It would rise with the wind before crashing back down. I would grumble at this, reel it in, untangle the line, and let it loose once more to fly up, up, up... and down again.

I would pull on the line, run down the beach, let the line out fast and let it out slow, stand here, try standing over there, wait for a certain wind, every trick I could think of and yet still I could not get the kite to stay in the sky. Grumble, reel, untangle, again.

It was hot, the sun beat down on my shoulders. The line would get caught under rocks when I was reeling it in. The kite would fall in the water and become sodden. Grumble, reel, untangle, again.

I was getting frustrated when I realized my folly. Here I was, on a beautiful beach, flying a kite on a gorgeous summer day, and grumbling about it.

I hope that this week you look for reasons to rejoice rather than reasons to grumble. We live in a beautiful province, and each of us has a hundred reasons to rejoice in the daily blessings God gives us. In the words of our catechism, "We have been made for joy", and my friends, sometimes joy is a choice. So may you rejoice together with creation this week, may you be blessed with reasons to rejoice, and may you have enough sense to smile when you are flying a kite on a beach in the sun.

*When he came near the place where the road goes down the Mount of Olives, the whole crowd of disciples began joyfully to praise God in loud voices for all the miracles they had seen:*

*"Blessed is the king who comes in the name of the Lord!"*

*"Peace in heaven and glory in the highest!"*

*Some of the Pharisees in the crowd said to Jesus, "Teacher, rebuke your disciples!"*

*"I tell you," he replied, "if they keep quiet, the stones will cry out." (Luke 19:37-40)*
