Message from the Minister:

One hot day this week, Michelle and the kids went to play at the splash pad at Bannerman park while I was working at the church. Once I was done for the day, I decided to walk over to meet them at the park; it's a very simple walk, since Portugal Cove Road takes you nearly from the church doorstep directly to the park, so I had the joy of a sunny walk down that familiar street. I drive down that street very often, since it's one of the most direct routes downtown from where I live, but its more rare that I walk it.

This time while I was walking I came across something I hadn't seen before: a variegated maple tree, whose leaves you can see pictured. It was beautiful, and the dappled light and dark colours of the leaves together with the movement of the wind and dancing sunbeams was striking enough that I stopped to take a picture and ponder how outrageous it would be to ask for a cutting.

I must have driven down that street a dozen times already this summer at the very least. This maple tree is huge and well established right next to the road. And yet, it was only this time, when I was walking, that I noticed it and was able to enjoy it.

We overlook blessings so easily. In our haste, we forget to rejoice. In worrying about one thing going wrong, we forget to give thanks for the ten things that went right. We complain about the rain and forget to smell the flowers. I hope that you will have some time this summer to enjoy the simplest gifts around: the feeling of the breeze and the sunshine on your face, the smell of flowers and the sounds of birds singing, the routine kindness of friends and family, and so much more. If you do not slow yourself down to intentionally consider all you have to be thankful for, you will have less rejoicing in your life.

Psalm 46 tells of God descending to force an end to our conflict and make us be still enough to notice God in the world. It is my hope we can learn to be still and give thanks without an apocalypse needed this week. For God's blessings are all around us even today. What Good News that is!
