Mission Moment – Sunday, October 2

After Mikabens's first birthday in Haiti, his health began to deteriorate rapidly, showing signs of severe malnutrition. His parents brought him to the hospital, where he was diagnosed with severe acute malnutrition and consequently admitted for therapeutic nutrition treatment. Mikabens has since gained close to two kilograms and will shortly be able to return home. Presbyterian World Service & Development's partnership with Zanmi Lasante (Partners in Health) and Canadian Foodgrains Bank is helping many young children in Haiti overcome critical malnutrition.

Thursday, October 6 We give thanks and pray for the Reformed Church in Transcarpathia and Bishop Sándor Zán-Fábián as the church provides physical and spiritual support to internally displaced people in Ukraine.

Friday, October 7 We pray for the members of the Special Committee on Petitions 1 and 2, 2021, as they continue to listen to stories of marginalization and discrimination in the church and work to design a statement of apology.

Saturday, October 8 We pray for the people who gather and serve at Cedar Tree Ministries on Vancouver Island, British Columbia, and we give thanks for their ministry.

Minister's Message



This past Friday marked the national "Day for Truth and Reconciliation", a day when we reflect back on the painful history of mistreatment that our Indigenous brothers and sisters have suffered at the hands of those who came from away. In my limited research into my family name, it appears that despite my obviously European ancestry, the Sturtevant's have lived in North America for centuries. My family history, it would seem, is as colonizers.

Days like this always remind me of something important about Sin, something that Newfoundlanders understand better than most. There's a saying here, when something goes wrong, someone is suffering bad luck or injustice at the hands of another, we might shake our heads sadly and say "What a sin...". When I first came here it was a surprise, but it quickly became one of my favorite Newfoundland expressions because of how theologically astute it is!

You see, "sin" isn't just about malice. Sin is, in the simplest sense, something that isn't going according to God's good plans. We live in a sinful world,

because we can see things in the world that aren't the way we know God would want them. The poor suffer, the weak are abandoned, selfishness and cruelty thrive. It's a sin!

*"Surely I was sinful at birth,
sinful from the time my mother conceived me." Psalm 51:5*

Sin marks our life on this earth. We live in an unjust world, and we have benefited and suffered unjustly while living in it. In a sense, not even a baby can be free of sin because their hunger, their pain, and their loneliness are not what God truly desires for them.

As we remember the Day for Truth and Reconciliation, we remember the sin that our indigenous brothers and sisters have suffered from, and in many cases continue to suffer from. May we work together to fight against every sin in our world today, to raise this world heavenward and bring hope, peace, joy and love to every human heart. And when our earthly work is done, we will find rest in God's kingdom where no-one will ever have cause to say "What a sin" ever again. What Good News that is!

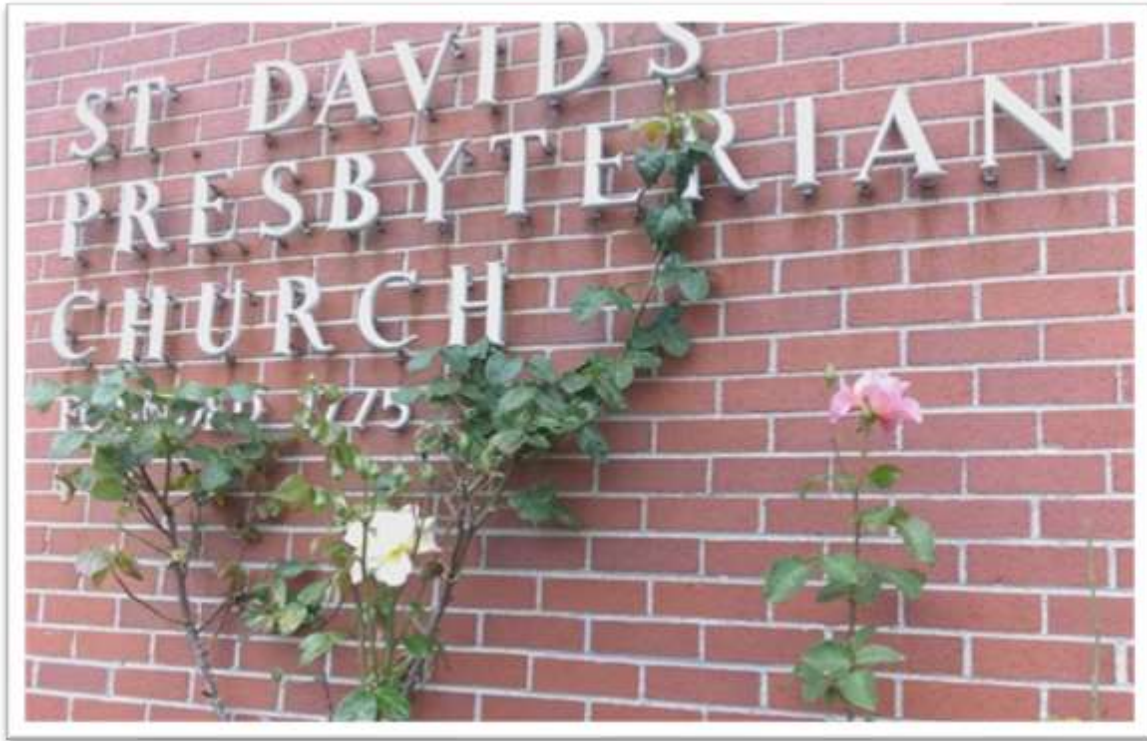

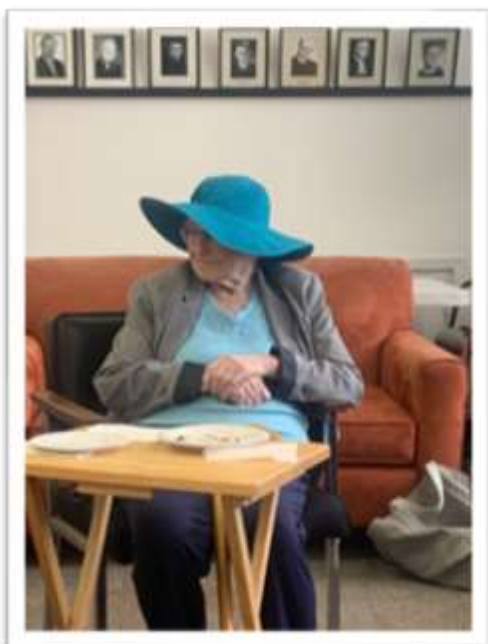
We will provide a Lectionary based curriculum for school-aged children. And we have lots of supplies on site waiting for use.
