Saturday, October 29 We pray for the members of the Canadian Ecumenical Anti-Racism Network of the Canadian Council of Churches as they collaborate to end racism in churches across Canada.

Minister's Message

This week I had the opportunity to go to the meeting of the Synod of the Presbyterian Churches in the Atlantic Provinces. This is an annual meeting in October, and the first time in a little while we've been able to get together in person. As a representative from Newfoundland, Synod covers the cost of my flight, and so I found myself searching for a flight from St. John's to the place Synod was being held this year: the small community of Hanwell, New Brunswick, just outside of Fredericton.



With Synod meeting in various places in the Atlantic provinces (it changes each year), I often get the opportunity to take some fairly small planes. The plane in this picture is a little Dash-8 Q100, maximum of 37 passengers (according to Google), that was taking me from Moncton to Fredericton, a flight of only about half an hour or so.

Some people don't like flying on little planes, but I am not one of them. I am always excited when boarding the plane means a walk across the tarmac, and when I saw the beautiful sunset behind my ride I just had to take a picture! If I'd been in a big 747 with an extendable hallway for boarding, I would have missed it. Small planes also fly lower, so you get a better view out the window.

Too often we focus on what we wish we could be without paying attention to the gifts we have now. That poor little Dash-8 might feel insignificant at an airport full of bigger planes, too slow, too small, propellers instead of fancy jet engines, no screens on the seats, and so on. By many of the most obvious measurements it's just not as good as they are. This week we will be hearing a story of humility from the Gospel, and we will be reminded of God's love for the humble and the small.

May you recognize that no matter how outdated, small or underpowered you feel, you have unique gifts that God can use. They may not be the same as the gifts of those around you, but not every plane needs to be a 747. God has made you and equipped you for your own path. What Good News that is.

Information from the Treasurer

Fiscal Updates

Over the next couple of weeks, you'll read some of the challenges this church now faces and some of the things we can all do to help.

If you look at this week's trivia questions and wait a week for the answers, you'll see how we fared with money management projects in the past.

You have all heard the quickly changing price of gas and in our case the cost of heating oil. St. David's has a flat rate monthly charge based on our previous usage history. That works out well, because on the first of November each year I get solid information for the budget. Last year that cost was set at \$1,535 per month. This year while we burned about the same amount of oil, the price moved up and down through the year. If, at the end of the year we burned more than was expected or the prices rose higher than expected, we must cover the difference. This year that will be around \$3,450.

Several years ago we were paying \$1,830 a month. So we did something. We set the thermostats to only come on when that space was being used. By the end of the year we were under budget and our monthly price dropped for the following year.

There's not much we can do about the price of oil, we can control how we use it. And that's what we've been doing.

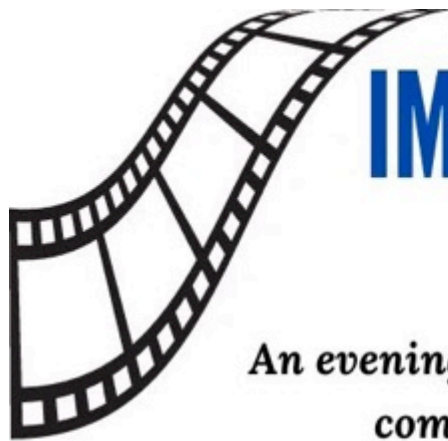
Quilts @ The Cathedral

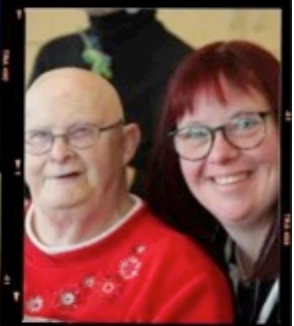

Church Trivia Questions

Last week the question was: Who was the only member of the Canadian military to serve as our minister?

The answer is: During World War II, John F. Nute became our minister from 1941 to 1943. He resigned from the church to become a Chaplain in the Royal Canadian Air Force. Rev. Nute was born in New Jersey in 1907 and attended the Wheaton and Westminster Seminary. In 1936 when he married Marjory Cox he was living in Nova Scotia and serving as a Presbyterian Minister. The family eventually moved to Maple Ridge BC, where John died on Oct 29, 1986. His wife died in 1997 and is buried beside her husband.

This week the question is: Who was the minister who came to the Queen's Road Church, discovered a \$15,000 debt and worked diligently with the congregation to pay off the mortgage? And for an extra question, that was done during a Thanksgiving ceremony in which year?
