# Mission Moment – Sunday, December 11th

In Nepal, 70-year-old Dhani Gharti found a boil on the sole of her foot. When she sought treatment, Dhani received a diagnosis of leprosy. Despite taking medication for a year, Dhani's wound kept coming back. One day, Dhani's friend told her about the Presbyterian World Service & Development-supported Shining Hospital, a Christian hospital run by the International Nepal Fellowship, where she thought Dhani could get more successful treatment. "Every time I visit the Shining Hospital with my wounded foot, the nurses always welcome me and give the best medical care. They always show love and care while dressing my wounds," shared Dhani.

## Treasurer's Announcement

### This week's thanks

The sanctuary is now fully ready for Christmas thanks to the Flemming family and friends who came in last Saturday to make the final touches on the tree and the creche. Great job and many thanks!

I'd also like to give a big thanks to Frank Fogwill who keeps the church and hall looking good all year around. He's also keeps an eye on the area around the church, front, back and sides. Heather has a calendar for Frank detailing what is happening and when so he can ensure we look good before and after those activities. Many thanks!

I'd also like to thank Lillian Crawford and the WA for everything they do, the Christmas dinner for the Good Companions, the bridge parties, and a whole lot of things we don't often see for example - clean ovens!

Lillian is also the leader for the Christmas hamper project. It partly explains why I was at Walmart yesterday getting Cheerios, since Santa is not the only one with a list! The budget for the hampers is some \$2,200 this year. We have only one dark cloud on the horizon - we may be in a bit of trouble over turkeys. Last year we were able to store over twenty LARGE turkeys in Bouwina and Frank's freezer. This year their freezer is unavailable. SO, we may be looking for some help, please spare a bit of room in your freezer for a turkey or two. Stay tuned!

# **Fiscal Updates**

You've been reading about some of the challenges this church now faces and some of the things we can all do to help.

Last week I mentioned the donations for Presbyterian Sharing were falling short of our commitment. What a change a week makes! We've exceeded this year's commitment. So Presbyterian Sharing will get the full amount

donated, our original commitment and then some! Thanks to those who stepped up.

I was very pleased to see the minister's appeal in last week's bulletin. The church is also living in times with lower income and higher expenses. Did you know we actually have two loans? One loan is from the Presbyterian Church in Canada (PCC) for the new hall windows (not the 2018 stained glass ones donated by families and groups) but the ones we put in during 2014 replacing the old aluminum ones. That was a \$65,000 loan running from 2015 to 2029 and if we pay it off on time, the PCC will refund the \$15,833 in interest we will have paid. That does sound a lot like how the federal CEBA loan works.

# Minister's Christmas Appeal

I have a very clear memory from the birth of my eldest son, standing in the birthing room holding my wife's hand and watching the doctor holding him up in the moments after he was delivered. He was red and squishy, as most newborns are and his eyes were closed. What I really remember though, was the very first time I saw him move, as his arms trembled a bit and pulled in towards his chest; I remember thinking that suddenly there was a whole other person in the room, someone new with a new body and a new will.

In the season of Christmas, we celebrate the birth of Jesus Christ, who came into the world in a very similar way. Christmas is a time of new beginnings, a new baby moving for the first time, a new family, a new relationship between God and creation, a new future opening up for the world! This was an unexpected and novel event, as the King came to dwell, not in the holiest and most sacred inner courts of the temple, but in a feeding trough in a backwater stable. The birth was made holy, not by incense, golden ornaments, or the fanfare of trumpets, but by the actions of a simple human family that welcomed God among them, nursed him, cradled him, and loved him. This season, we remember that Christmas is not about fancy surroundings, but about starting something new with love at the start.

Here at St. David's, we are excited to find ourselves in a time of change. I have spent nearly half of my time here under COVID lockdowns, so our full and busy schedule of Advent activities this year brings such joy to my heart! We are a vibrant community, and having the chance to bring joy and laughter to seniors with our Good Companions group, worship with the wonderful music of the Tenacious String Orchestra, and even share a simple cup of coffee after the service again is a powerful reminder of the love for God and neighbour that motivates all we do.

That being said, it will be no surprise to you to learn that COVID has been a hard time for our church. With in-person services suspended and no groups looking to rent our spaces during the week, we were glad for the opportunity presented by the federal government to participate in the CEBA program, which allowed us to receive an interest-free loan of \$40,000 to help us through the last few years. We are now looking to repay that loan, and I believe that with your help we can do it!

We have already saved up \$10,000 to put towards the loan. Significantly, the Government only requires \$30,000 to be repaid IF payment is made within the next year. Although we still have a years worth of time to try to save and raise the last \$20,000, we have chosen to make a special appeal to you, as a member of the congregation, to ask if you would be willing to help us pay down the loan so that we can focus our attention on new initiatives and ministries instead of recovering from the last few years.

I know this has been a hard time for many, so I hope that even if you are not able to contribute financially to this "Pay Off the Loan" appeal you will still consider taking new steps this year to support our ministries with volunteering your time and energy. We would welcome your support for our seniors group, our community meals, the Bridges to Hope food bank, our children's ministry, our work with refugees, or perhaps with a new ministry idea that God has placed on your own heart!

As we look to the manger, we remember that God can use even the smallest gifts to do great things. With your help, the future of this city and this world will be shaped by the love that filled that stable. This is a time of new beginnings, of new hope and new compassion. To you and yours, Merry Christmas, and may God fill your holidays with every blessing that truly matters.
