


## News from the Pews for the Second Sunday of Lent, March 5th, 2023

## **Treasurer's Update for this Week**

Annual reports are now due! Remember, if the reports are slow to come in, I will offer to do up one for you or your group. A decision on the date for the Annual Congregational Meeting (ACM) will be made at the next Session meeting (scheduled for March 14th).

All the information our auditor needs to prepare our Review Engagement Report (RER), has been sent along to her. The RER is used for many things: It is included as a report for our AGM; It is sent to the PCC as part of our annual statistical and financial report; It is sent to the Federal Government and becomes part of our profile for the Canada Revenue Agency's (CRA) List of Charities.

Our \$10,000 Line of Credit (LOC) with RBC is expected to be used this month for the first time in a long time, however, some invoices and commitments will not be paid when due. Salaries, contracts, and local invoices will continue to be paid when possible.

The results of the appeal letter are beginning to show some results. For example, this week we received a letter from one of our members who is not able to come to church often but still wants to help us out. The letter also added a comment about one of the things that started during COVID-19 that was appreciated, the book club.

While our finances are still not good, we do get regular monthly donations through the PAD, on Sundays, from increasing rentals and by e-Transfers. Please consider this as you make choices about your donations to the church. Thank you to all those who have made donations and continue to do so.

## **From The Board of Managers**

You may have heard that we have a small group who are enthusiastically looking forward to expanding our Board of Managers. This group is hoping to get new members to reduce the number of persons who already have other duties at the Church.

One of the items spoken about was the family and group member concept. This permits families and other groups to be defined to agree to join as a single board member. The Board simply requests a commitment, the group will have one of its members attend each meeting and report back to all group participants. All group members will receive minutes of meetings directly from the Board.

Keep in mind that based on great technology links allowing us to have email conversations, the Board anticipates only needing quarterly meetings for the purpose of voting on recommendations the Board will be suggesting to Session to be reported to the congregation. At the Board meetings multiple members of a group would be welcomed to attend in person but that group would have 1 vote.

It contains a description of who we are, what we do, and a summary financial picture, with a more detailed financial statement at another level of detail.
