Minister's Message



Some of you may recognize this week's picture as coming from what some might consider to be not a very spiritual place: the Robin Hood Bay garbage disposal facility right here in St. John's! This week, we managed to make good on a project that has been on our to-do list since last fall when we bought the house we had been renting, cleaning out the shed.

The shed started out full of a mess of tools, toys, camping gear, patio furniture, boxes of screws, and gardening gear. Some of it was ours, but some had been there when we started renting. For example, when we moved in, we had a patio set for four people and discovered another set for six in the shed. So, we started using the bigger set and put ours in the shed in case we moved and needed it again. Kids toys got picked up from the yard so the lawnmower wouldn't hit them and thrown in the shed. Old tools and equipment that had been in the shed when we arrived had stayed there. The rust on them made me suspect they would never be usable again, but it seemed better to keep them than risk the ire of the landlord if we moved out and they found things missing.

But after buying the house, it became our shed. It was almost a pleasure to pull everything out and fill up a trailer with things to go to the dump or to charity! And now, after a few days of work, the shed is finally all cleared out and only holds the things we actually want in there.

Truly, it was an exercise in the joy of letting things go. I am prone to holding onto things "just in case", but even I could see the benefit of letting go as the space emptied out and the shelves became usable again. Old rusty cans of paint can go, and in exchange I get that shelf back. How strange it is, to feel relief at watching a trailer full of your own stuff go to the dump, but that is the state my shed was in!

"Get rid of all bitterness, rage and anger, brawling and slander, along with every form of malice. Be kind and compassionate to one another, forgiving each other, just as in Christ God forgave you." (Ephesians 4:31–32)

The Christian faith involves a fair bit of learning to let go of things. Sometimes, we cling to things because they seem valuable to us, and it can be hard to accept new changes. We cling to things that we ought to realize serve no purpose, like the bitterness, rage and anger that Paul writes about in this passage from Ephesians, without realizing that we would be happier if we let them go.

May God help us all learn to let go of the things in our lives and in our hearts that do not serve us anymore. May we let go of grudges and gripes and move on to find happiness. May we let go of old dreams to make way for new ones. May we make a fearless inventory of our own hearts and have the wisdom to know what we would be better off without.

For our God is the God of new beginnings and second lives, and God has plans to use us for good in this world. That's Good News! By God's grace, we can all find new things to celebrate. Even the most tired among us can be surprised by the new gifts of God!

But Lord, if you have new gifts for me, please hang onto them for a little while. For now, my shed is empty and clean, and I'd like to enjoy it for a while before I start filling it up again!

Treasurer's Report, Session and Board of Managers (BoM) Updates

Treasurer's Report

Late last week we received the \$30,000 grant from the St. Aiden's Fund, Lillian deposited it into our account. I looked at the account and then checked with our account manager to see if there were any holds. So early the next morning (0545 hours Saturday July 8th before going fishing) I moved \$30,000 into the CEBA Visa account. From now on, I'll talk about an \$80K (eighty thousand dollar) deficit which is better than that \$110k one.

So, if you've been reading these reports for a while, our outlook is less dire, however it will still take some managing. I report monthly to three groups: Board of Managers (BOM), Session and the Futures Committee. These groups are involved in moving this congregation towards a better financial future. While that work is in progress, I am managing the new \$80,000 deficit to a greater or lesser extent.

Last week I promised an updated spreadsheet (picture) of our finances, after the month- start for July and including the mid-month payments (our staff and contractors, the CRA and PCC benefits and pensions, and our insurance.


A Beautiful Find at The Rooms

Mission Moment – Presbyterian World Service & Development Sunday, July 16th 2023

After their summer crop failed and they lost their agricultural loan, Moolo and his wife Babbri, who live in Pakistan, were in financial trouble and were going hungry. Given the gravity of their situation, they managed to receive food assistance from PWS&D's partner in their community. The amount received was sufficient to cover some other basic needs and meant that the elderly couple could use their small savings to provide daily medication to their son Chandan, who has epilepsy. With their remaining savings, Moolo hoped to open a small store, but his eyesight was deteriorating. Babbri stepped up and opened the store herself, remarking, "It is because of this aid that we are not under debt, or we would have sold our goats to pay for food. But we are not in debt and still have our goats!"
