#### Minister's Message

I spent most of this week at the annual meeting of the General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church in Canada, a meeting of Presbyterian ministers and elders from all across the country. Many items of interest were accomplished, including the election of the Rev. Mary Fontaine as the moderator of our national church. Rev. Fontaine is an indigenous woman, and her induction ceremony involved many spiritual practices from the indigenous Christian community, including a smudging ceremony and reciting the Lord's Prayer in Cree. As churches in Canada struggle with the legacy of the residential school system, it is encouraging to see our moderator reflect a vision of the church that reconciles and transcends the struggles of our past.

We heard many stories of the ministries of the Presbyterian Church in Canada, and it is always uplifting to hear stories of the good work our church is supporting. This year's recipients of the Cutting Edge of Mission award were an example of this; two women representing the Parents' Circle - Families Forum, a joint Israeli-Palestinian organization of over 600 families who have lost immediate family members to the ongoing conflict and who work together for reconciliation and a just resolution to the conflict. It is good to see our church supporting a group like this that is working for peace, a mission around the world that your church is participating in!

It was a busy week though, so my message is brief. I would love to talk more with you about General Assembly (or anything else!), and I'll leave you with one final picture of the commissioners voting on a motion using our yellow cards. I am voting in the picture, but it may be tricky to find me!





## **Treasurer's Update for this Week**

I'm not sure how many times I can dire in association with our finances. Having said that I do report monthly to three groups: Board of Managers (BOM), Session and the Futures Committee. These groups are involved in moving this congregation towards a better financial future. While that work is in progress, I am managing the \$110,000 deficit to a greater or lesser extent. ## <u>Mission Moment – Presbyterian World Service & Development</u> Sunday, June 11th, 2023



Prema and her five children live in the Umerkot district of Pakistan. After her husband's death, Prema found it very difficult to provide for her family, and severe drought throughout the district only brought more hardship. Her eldest son tried hard to find work so that he could help support his mother and siblings, but despite his best efforts, his job prospects were limited due to a physical disability. A glimmer of hope came when Prema and her family were selected for a food assistance project run by Presbyterian World Service & Development's local partner. The food aid that Prema's family has received through the project has helped them to become more resilient to future adverse events.
