#### Minister's Message



In my yard at home, I have two patches of rhubarb that are coming up nicely. Each year, they are one of the first things to be ready for harvest, and my kids sometimes like to ask me to pick a stem for them to eat raw. Usually though, we end up making a couple of harvests and making something out of it, whether it be strawberry-rhubarb jam, adding rhubarb to some muffins, or something more adventurous, like last year when I made some rhubarb-infused simple syrup (which worked pretty well for making a bright pink pseudo-lemonade).

This rhubarb has been here since we started living in this house, and it's faithfully produced more rhubarb than we can use each year. Knowing this, when we went over to visit some friends this past week, I pulled off a couple stems to give to them so they could enjoy the bounty of the season. They were grateful to receive it, and we talked a bit about how the few stalks I had shared would have cost eight or nine dollars at the grocery store.

As followers of Christ, I think it is an important part of living out our faith for us to consider the blessings that we have and how we can share them with others. Jesus is constantly proclaiming the importance of caring for those who have less, and his words to the rich young ruler who wanted to know how to inherit eternal life are I

think just as difficult for us to hear as they were for him: "Go, sell everything you have and give to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven. Then come, follow me."

How hard it is to give up what we have for the sake of others! But perhaps there is encouragement to be found in the rhubarb patch: our generosity and our sharing doesn't have to cost us much. I can share my rhubarb easily, and the ten seconds of harvesting I did may bring many smiles to those who eat the rhubarb muffins it makes.

So may you consider what you have to share with those around you this summer. If you have an abundance of time, remember those who are lonely and give them a phone call. If you have an abundance of berries, gather some up to share with a neighbour. If you have an old barbeque you are replacing, try to find a new home for it rather than throwing it away. These are gifts that cost so little to give, but can make an impact nonetheless.

May we be a church who shares what we have. May we have the wisdom to realize when we have gifts to share that will cost us little, and grow in generosity with these simple things. For as we practice the habit of sharing, it will grow in our hearts without our noticing, and sweeten all the world around us.

# **Treasurer's Update for this Week**

Last week I reported to the Board of Managers (BOM), this week I've reported to Session and next week, it's the Futures Committee. These groups are involved in moving this congregation towards a better financial future. While that work is in progress, I am managing the \$110,000 deficit to a greater or lesser extent. This is where we are now:

- a) the Session has approved my use of the interest and dividends from the Memorial Fund.
- b) Session has also approved a loan, repayable when we are able, from the Memorial Fund. This loan would only be used as a last resort when all other options have been exhausted. It will be created in our accounting system as an account payable, the same as the loans from the PCC and the federal CEBA program.
- c) As of this date we still have \$6,000 available on our line of credit (LOC).
- d) On Tuesday, before writing my report for Session, I spent five (5) hours crunching numbers and using only the income I could depend upon. It anticipated our normal costs plus the auditor's invoice and NO MAJOR PROBLEMS over the summer.
- e) Needless to say, I am always looking at other initiatives, as well.

I would like to thank Session for allowing the funds from the Memorial Fund to be available when they are required. I would also like to sincerely thank all the people involved in the Plant Sale and the WA for their recent hard work and the donations that came from that effort.

I would also like to remind people that we are still open over the summer, even though many of us will be at our cabins or summer homes. By the way, I have a newly found appreciation for e-transfers, especially at the Plant Sale.

Please consider St. David's this summer and my thanks for your regular monthly donations (PAD, on Sundays, E-transfers) and from the summertime rentals.

I still will be issuing weekly updates on the state of our finances and perhaps even an article or two on "What would you do for your church"! Have a good summer (now that is has actually stated in St. John's)!

The activities in the church are starting to wind down as summer approaches.

However, we do have a bunch of things still happening: church every Sunday, someone in the office, various rentals are continuing throughout the summer, the grass is still growing, the plants may need some water and dead-heading, the trees may need a brush cut, and so on.

If we were to ask for help some day, certainly on a day when the dump is open, could you spare an hour to help out? If many people just did one hour's sweeping, picking up litter, and a number of other small tasks, the church would soon look even more beautiful and welcoming.

Last week, I also mentioned a fall veggie sale. For the plant sale I dropped off almost two hundred Romaine lettuce seedlings. I have other things growing and while I like Caesar salad, I might not be able to keep up with the #%@\*& lettuce. I'm still thinking. At harvest time would you like to partake in a veggie or fruit sale? It could be "bring and buy", bring, or simply buy. Let's see how the growing season gets on.



# <u>Mission Moment – Presbyterian World Service & Development</u> Sunday, June 25th, 2023



Orphaned as a teenager, Fouzia was adopted by her aunt and uncle, whom she came to live with in Kabul, Afghanistan. After the Taliban took control, the family fled to Pakistan, where they could scarcely find work as they lacked the necessary legal documents. They were then selected for a food assistance project supported by Presbyterian World Service & Development. Through the project, Fouzia's family received assistance to help ensure that they are able to meet their food needs while her uncle and aunt look for a source of income in Pakistan, providing a sense of relief in the face of great uncertainty. "With funds received, my aunt bought food items so that we have sufficient meals every day," said Fouzia.
