Minister's Message

This is David's second week of study leave and he starts four weeks of vacation next week.

Did you know that each year, we budget \$600 for study leave. This can be used to attend courses, sign up for webinars, and purchase study guides or books.

This is the first time David has taken study leave since he became our minister back in March 2017. This, in fact, is his sabbatical.

Treasurer's Report, Session and Board of Managers (BoM) Updates Treasurer's Report

The month of July was a very good month for us, we took in just over \$1,350 more than we spent. We took in \$48,200 and spent \$46,850, including the \$30,000 which we used to pay off the CEBA loan. We still owe money, some \$19,000, mainly to the PCC (\$15,400). We are hanging in there, and for that I am grateful.

While our finances are not good, we do get regular monthly donations (PAD, on Sundays, E-transfers) and from increasing rentals. Please consider this as you make choices about your donations to the church.

Thank you to all who are continuing to donate to your church through your envelopes on Sunday mornings, by e-transfers, or through your monthly PAD contributions. My thanks go out to elders and friends who happily and gladly pick-up envelopes from those not able to get out and help by dropping them off at the church office.

Update on our Zoom and YouTube Links

For those of you who view our services on-line via Zoom or YouTube, you may have noticed several things in the past two weeks. We have a new camera operating remotely. It's situated up on the wall of the gallery above the clock and "Boy, does it work well!" We've gotten at least one email saying how great the picture is and the sound has also improved. The camera's settings allow us to have five predefined views (minister's lectern, reader's lectern, front of church view, baptismal font, and church steps) and we can possibly have more "set" views – like the Christmas tree, the plaque for November 11th service, the stained-glass windows, the Memorial Tree or make subtle changes like those. The sound has also improved since it "thinks" about where the sound is coming from (we do have five operational mikes) and it dampens the other mikes = improved sound. The camera has a great zoom feature allowing the operator to zoom onto the person reading the Bible, or speaking with the kids, etc. . The laptop is set-up for the next six weeks, having both the Zoom and six YouTube addresses ready to roll. Using this camera, we can now also record funerals and perhaps, weddings.

By the time you will have read this, David has been busy training people in its use and we will have at least five people who are able to operate the camera.

Concert Series - Second Concert (August 10, 2023)

This past week, the second "Brian Way and Friends" concert took place at St. David's Church Hall. Brian's "friends" this week were Karla Pilgrim and Dominic Greene. What a tremendous evening! <u>Mission Moment – Presbyterian World Service & Development</u> Sunday, August 13th, 2023



Palestinians living in the Occupied Territories know that Ecumenical Accompaniers (EAs) don't have much power to stop the occupation. But they are grateful for the protective presence of EAs at checkpoints, refugee camps, schools and remote villages where shepherds watch their flocks. In response to an appeal from local church leaders, the World Council of Churches created the Ecumenical Accompaniment Program in Palestine and Israel in 2002. Supported by Presbyterians Sharing, the Rev. Jeanie Lee recently served three months in Bethlehem, witnessing life under occupation, monitoring human rights violations, and listening to stories of Palestinians to share with Canadians upon her return.
