Minister's Message



Today's Message from the Minister is, in large part, an advertisement for one of the Christmas services we are offering this year. Thursday, December 21st marks the winter solstice, the shortest day of the year with the longest, darkest night. On that evening, we will be holding a Blue Christmas service at 7 PM, a small service with a more serious tone than the usual joyful feel of the Christmas season. This service is designed for those who feel out of place this Christmas season, perhaps because the death of a loved one is still fresh, or because their loss happened around Christmastime. Last year, the service was not very well attended, but that did not bother me. Last year, I was the one who needed it!

That service was the only time I've cried most of the way through giving a sermon. We'd had a hard year, losing both of our beloved cats randomly to a heart attack and then a brain tumor during the second half of the year, and then suffering a miscarriage just weeks before Christmastime. These events impacted my kids less than Michelle and I, which meant we had to keep Christmas special for them through all of this. While I still found some joy in the celebrations of Christmas, there was also a real part of me that was wading through the fog, just wanting the year to be over. It is hard work to make Christmas special for the people around you when you feel all hollowed out.

Please remember those around you who find this a difficult time of year. Remember those whose family and friends have died, and those who are without work and cannot afford to celebrate in the ways they want to. Remember those who are going through great stress in this time, and those who are left alone as everyone else celebrates.

And invite them to our Blue Christmas service, on Thursday at 7 PM. The stable is open to those who mourn, those who have no-where else to go, the lost, and the lonely. The deepest meaning of the season is that Christ comes to people such as these and meets them where they're at. Even if Christmas isn't feeling "Merry" at all, that's still the truth we can cling to, and it's still Good News that can help a weary soul.

We have people bringing in the boxes, putting the boxes together, setting up tables, gathering all the food and laying it out, our four super packers, the team getting the food out the door and our great team of drivers. Throughout the year St. David's has its guardian angels watching over us and helping us in so many ways.
