#### Minister's Message



Christmas, more than any other holiday I know, has a lot of symbols. Candy canes, stockings, trees, reindeer, ornaments, mangers, stars, and more and more.

And not only the symbols, there are so many Christmas traditions! Leaving out milk and cookies, opening presents, seeing the lights, sharing a feast, going to church, having an orange at the toe of your stocking. There are so many pieces to make a "real Christmas" that its no wonder the season can feel exhausting. With two children at home (one of whom is bouncing around me as I write this, already started his Christmas break), I know better than ever how little time there can be to stop and take a breath during this season. But my Christmas prayer for you (and for myself) is that we will not forget the real meaning of Christmas. In the story of Christmas, God comes to an ordinary couple who are unprepared for him. They are away from home, crashing in a stable, disrupted by a government decree. Their Christmas is not going at all as planned, and yet Jesus comes to them.
