Minister's Message



This morning when I was getting up, I noticed that my boys were being quieter than usual. Usually, that's a worrying sign, so I quietly made my way over to where I knew they were so that I could catch them in the act of whatever it was they were up to.

Lo and behold, what I found was Oliver, reading a book to his brother on the couch. It's sometimes hard for me to track just how good Oliver is at reading, because he doesn't like to sound out words out loud, so he'll just look at them for a while and then surprise you by reading the whole sentence at once. Nevertheless, he is a great reader and was telling Orson the story of "Sam and the Firefly" with expression, barely slowing down on any of the words. It was a proud dad moment, seeing him read so well and watching his little brother snuggle in for the story. I remember teaching Oliver his letters. Heck, I remember teaching him to use a spoon! If there is one thing that is amazing about parenting, it is the chance to watch children grow and change at such an amazing pace, growing to have new skills and becoming new people as day after day they become the people they were meant to be.

When Jesus' disciples tried to keep the little children from him, he rebuked them and told them that "anyone who will not receive the kingdom of God like a little child will never enter it."(Mark 10:15). Perhaps part of what that means is to have a mind that grows and changes, that learns new things and is willing to be transformed from one day to the next. Treasurer's Report

We are definitely in the middle of January and all that entails. The last CRA payment has been made and the T4's are next. The file for Ian has been tabulated and just needs a final review, the creation of the blank receipts for Ian and file of addresses for the envelopes are both works in progress. Heather is helping with that.

Meanwhile I've been looking at some of the results from last year. We gave substantially more this year to Bridges to Hope, \$325 in 2022 and over \$2,180 in 2023. We committed to \$8,100 for Presbyterian Sharing for 2023

and only received just over \$7,200 so that was topped up to meet our commitment.

Next week I will be in touch with our auditor to discuss the review process for 2023 and get an idea of dates for completion. There is always something!

Thank you to all who are continuing to donate to your church through your envelopes on Sunday mornings, by e-transfers, or through your monthly PAD contributions. My thanks go out to elders and friends who happily and gladly pick-up envelopes from those not able to get out and help by dropping them off at the church office.
