Minister's Message

This week, I had the somewhat unique pleasure of representing the Presbyterian Church at the installation of the new Lieutenant Governor, which took place at the Confederation Building. It was invite-only, and my seat was on the main floor with a good view. Of particular interest to me was the ceremonial lighting of a Kullik (or Qulliq), an Inuit lamp that carried the significance of a hearth, providing warmth and light to the home and now often used as a ceremonial symbol.

The lamp was lit by an elder from the First Light community, with the fire being started separately at both ends of a long horizontal wick, with the fire soon spreading to meet in the middle as the kullik began to burn in earnest. As the two fires came together, she said, she hoped that those assembled would be unified. It was a fitting symbol for the room, designed with a central aisle splitting the government seats from those of the opposition, and the kullik placed in between.

Kullik Lighting

The Kullik is an Inuit lamp made of soapstone.

The lamp was traditionally used by women to care for their families, for cooking, drying wet clothes, providing light, and creating warmth within the home.

It is a symbol of Inuit resilience and ingenuity to survive in the harsh conditions of the North. Today, the Kullik has taken on a ceremonial function and is often lit to mark important occasions.

The service itself was interesting to me, because it carried all of the solemnity and structure of a worship service, but centred around an entirely different figure. The oaths that were sworn were to protect the interests of

"King Charles the Third, and his Heirs and Successors". As someone who has led many a baptismal family to proclaim their allegiance to Jesus Christ, it does feel a bit strange to witness oaths that are so similar but with a human object, and it is a reminder of the old systems of power still firmly at work in our world.

May we all remember our first and strongest loyalty is to Jesus Christ and to the mission of God we see revealed in the scriptures. May we work for love, grace, peace and forgiveness more than for the empires of man. May we be voices for unity in the world, bringing opposing sides together. For God is Lord of all, as likely to be found in a cattle stall as in the halls of power, loving the powerless and befriending sinners. That's the King I want to follow.
