# **Treasurer's Report**

Last week I reported to Session and the Board on our financial status and its outlook for the remainder of the year.

The following was reported to the Session and the Board, as a snapshot of our finances at one moment in time, at 2300 hours Oct 23<sup>rd</sup>. The actual report made to the two groups is highlighted in italics.

#### As reported to Session and the Board

Firstly – the current account:

As of 2300 hours Oct 23 2023, the current account balance is \$2,275.35.

**Secondly** – the fund previously called the sinking fund, now our "savings" account, where directed monies are held for later dispersal:

The fund previously called the sinking fund contains \$4,128.40 which is designated for various purposes: a portion of the paving project, amounts designated for various church groups like Sunday School, Good Companions, and Coffee Time.

Thirdly – the Visa account:

The Visa account balance is 0.00, its due date being Oct  $23^{rd}$ .

**Fourthly** – the LOC:

The operating line of credit is \$4,000, meaning we have \$6,000 available when needed.

**Fifthly** – the Memorial Account which is comprised of two items – the Hammond Fund and the Operating Fund, both maintained in the Bank of Montreal:

The Memorial Fund is in Bank of Montreal (BOM). There are two accounts: the Hammond account is valued at \$1,865.24 and its 2023 cash account is \$133.06, the main "operating" account is valued at \$45,360 and its 2023 cash account is \$1,598.40. The total cash available in the Memorial Fund is \$5,362.05.

**Finally** - my comment on the overall state of affairs:

We are hanging in there, barely. I expect the use of the LOC will occur at the Oct-Nov month-end and month-start.

#### What we owe to the PCC:

The amounts currently due to the PCC are any current outstanding amounts due **plus** any amounts due by yearend:

- *minister's pension amounts overdue plus due \$3,831.12*
- congregational assessment amounts overdue plus due \$5,398.84
- medical/dental invoices overdue \$4,918.00
- PCC loan overdue plus due \$7,076
- Presbyterian Sharing \$8,100
- Synod \$2,699.42
- Presbytery \$1,500

For a total due of approximately \$33,524.

#### Outlook on our year-end deficit:

The projected deficit for 2023 is comprised of:

• PCC	\$33,524
• Snow clearing	\$ 3,726 (Note 1)
• Undefined	\$13,224 (Note 2)

Our projected deficit at the end of December 2023 is \$50,474.

Note 1: We have received a quote from Formac for a new three-year contract of \$9,720 + HST or \$11,178 per year for snow clearing from Nov 1 to April 20 each year covering the period November 2023 to April 2026. This contract will be discussed at the BOM this coming Thursday. It should be noted that we will receive back ½ of the HST each year, some \$729, making the actual annual cost \$10,449.

Note 2: The amounts undefined may be but are not limited to: Nfld Power, Bell Aliant, RBC Visa, LOC, CRA, and Frank Fogwill (note some items are not received before yearend or are only due and payable in the following month.

#### Where we are now:

There have been some changes:

- The LOC was used (\$6,000) to help pay the October month-end and November month-start payrolls, some \$6,686. Our LOC now stands at \$10,000. We have used the full amount of \$10,000.
- 2) Our Visa now has a small balance, and
- 3) Our bank balance will be approximately \$1,500 by the time you read this.

## Annual General Meeting (AGM) 2023 Budget

At the beginning of the year the deficit was projected at \$110,000. That budget was passed in the AGM. Using the St. Aiden's Fund, \$30,000 was used to payoff the federal (CEBA) loan, immediately dropping the project deficit to \$80,000. Throughout the year, we had higher rentals, some slight increases in givings and we cut back on our expenses wherever possible.

I do look forward to the months of November and December when we generally do well financially. In 2021 and 2022 respectively we received \$36,850 and \$50,121 in those months.

Thank you to all who are continuing to donate to your church through your envelopes on Sunday mornings, by e-transfers, or through your monthly PAD contributions. My thanks go out to elders and friends who happily and gladly pick-up envelopes from those not able to get out and help by dropping them off at the church office. By the way, the sole email address we are using to accept donations is <u>stdavidsnfld@gmail.com</u> and this one is linked to our bank account and it will automatically accept all donations.

To make ends meet, she sorts plastic bottles from the landfill, with her five-year-old daughter Kaitlin often accompanying her. Leslie's other daughter, Naomi, attends the PWS&D-supported Francisco Coll School. At this school, she has developed essential reading and writing skills. Leslie also participates in parenting classes, noting, "[It's] very helpful because I've changed the way I parent. I shout less. I used to come home from work and start shouting at the kids, but I've learned differently. The classes are very beneficial."
