# Rev. David's Message



Today's picture is of a marvel both ancient and modern at the same time. This plant has been named "Methuselah", and it is a Judean Date Palm grown from a preserved 2,000 year old seed, making it the oldest seed to be germinated with human assistance. If you have ever wondered what the original Palms from Palm Sunday might have looked like, I think you could hardly do better than to consider the branches of Methuselah here, grown from a seed that may even (If I can take a little imaginative license) have fallen to the ground when those following Jesus brushed past it. Sadly, our palms will not be quite this glorious on Sunday. For one thing, the branches aren't eight feet long. It's not easy to find palm branches in Newfoundland in March, and dates certainly don't grow here at any time of the year.

Using palms in the service illustrates to me one of the strange tensions of reading the Bible. The story in Mark says that people "spread branches they had cut in the fields." The palms being laid down were brought by the people who gathered to welcome Jesus, and although the palm branch was symbolic for the people of the time as a symbol of victory, they were also a sensible contribution grown from the soil of their land.

Is the most accurate way to remember this story to import palm branches from a far-away land? Or would it, perhaps, be more fitting to celebrate Palm Sunday by asking members of the congregation to bring in whatever boughs they could find from the fields and forests of Newfoundland? Should we remember and emulate the specific methods and events of Palestine in millenia gone by and thus honour the reality of that story, or would we better capture the spirit of the story by bringing different boughs? How we look at scripture, and the tools we use to understand how we can imitate it in our daily lives, is an important question. In terms of the branches being palm or spruce, it's largely an aesthetic concern. But it is always important for us to consider the underlying messages and motivations in each passage of scripture we read and ask ourselves if the traditions we are used to are adding to, or taking away from, that message.

I encourage you to ask these sorts of questions of the scriptures and of your minister. For in scripture we find the living Word of God, fresh for each new day and season. May God Bless you this Holy Week with the reminder that this is a time of death and rebirth, of new life unexpectedly triumphing. That's Good News!

### **Treasurer's Report**

In getting ready for the Annual Report, I'd like to point out some "points to ponder". The amount we agree to send the PCC for Presbyterian Sharing last year was \$8,100 down from their ask of \$14,479. Even with that lower amount, we did not meet that commitment and took \$896 from our current account to meet it. However, last year we donated the most we have ever given to Bridges to Hope, both from a monetary basis and in actual food donations.

Thank you to all who are continuing to donate to your church through your envelopes on Sunday mornings, by e-transfers, or through your monthly PAD contributions. My thanks go out to elders and friends who happily and gladly pick-up envelopes from those not able to get out and help by dropping them off at the church office.

## What would you do for your Church?

Last week I highlighted some of the church activity in which people are taking part, those were about the new members on the Board, the people helping Sarah McMeekin with Sunday School, and people working on ways to help us communicate better with you and with the general community.

This week, I'm hoping to interest you in some of our ongoing activities. Did you know that we have a group of church members and friends playing pickleball every Wednesday afternoon and another group who play on Fridays? Would you like to join the Wednesday players? Yes, there is a coffee/tea break and some cookies!

Sweets and snacks are often requested by Bridges to Hope clients and previously we had muffin-making Mondays. This activity can be any morning that the Church kitchen is free – doesn't have to be Monday! We'd really like to revive this practice!

We have other opportunities where you can make a difference and take part of the life in our church.
