Rev. David's Message



This week, when I was looking over Brian's hymn suggestions, I realized that one of them used to have different lyrics that some of you may be more familiar with. The hymn I am familiar with, "God is love, come heaven, adoring" used to be sung as "God is love, let heaven adore Him". The reason for the change is a common one, as hymn lyrics are re-written to avoid using He or Him for God so that our image of who God is does not inadvertently elevate one of the sexes above the other in our minds. In the case of this particular hymn, I think the effort is more well done than is sometimes the case. The poetry is maintained well, and words don't feel out of place. Theologically, God has always transcended the male/female distinction, and all people, whether they be male, female, or the rare few born without distinguishable sex, are equally made in God's own image. It goes without saying that God is neither a man nor a woman (unless we are talking about the man Jesus Christ), but nevertheless, we have a long history of using masculine pronouns when referring to God as a sign of respect from a time when positions of authority were viewed as belonging rightfully to men.

Change can be uncomfortable. There is nowhere that this effort to use nongendered language is more uncomfortable than in old familiar hymns. I have a hard time singing hymns like "Who made the earth and the heaven" from our hymn book, because I know it so much better as "He's got the whole world in His hands". I struggle with "To God be the glory" because I end up accidentally singing "great things He hath done" at the end instead of "who great things has done" as it says in the hymn book. I may accept in my head that God is not a man, but I feel embarrassed when I sing the wrong words and then I grumble to myself about whether the change was really needed, more because I am embarrassed than out of some deep theological reasoning.

But this week, I realized that "God is love, come heaven adoring" was, for me, the familiar words. I know some people may be grumbling about how they prefered the old words, but for me, these are the words I grew up with. In the same way, my children will grow up with different hymns than I did, and perhaps that may help them to value the traditionally feminine values of God a little more: compassion, tenderness, mercy, and gentleness. Sometimes, change can be uncomfortable. Sometimes we work for changes that will benefit other people at our own cost. That is what Christ did, when he suffered and died for us, and that is the kind of life he calls us to live. So when you are faced with a change you do not love, but know is the right one, may you have faith that goodness outlasts suffering. We may stumble over the lyrics for a generation, but the song will endure beyond that and will bring hearts to God long after we are gone, speaking to a new generation with words that are familiar to them. That's Good News!
