While back in Ontario for General Assembly, I stumbled across this beautiful bronze sculpture in front of a local church. From a distance, the huddled figure on the bench looks all-too-familiar in the urban setting, a sleeping form huddled in a blanket, best left alone.

When you get a little closer, you realize it is a statue, and wonder why there is a statue of a homeless person there.

Only if you stop to examine the statue do you notice the one identifying feature sticking out from the bottom of the blanket, a pair of dirty feet huddled together, bearing the marks of the nails that pierced Christ on the cross.

May we have eyes to see the dignity and worth of Christ in every bit of human life that is in our city. May we, as Christians, place higher value on those that get called worthless, and thus puzzle the more worldly-minded. May we recognize the call to love the "Least of these" and so show our devotion to Christ.

It is with great sadness that we announce the passing of Michael Stead Crawford on June 8th, 2024, at age 46, after a brief but courageous fight with cancer. He was predeceased by father-in-law Rhodie Mercer; and uncles Gerard Murphy and Donald Murphy.

Leaving to mourn are his wife, Adrienne Mercer and daughter, his princess, Claire Crawford; parents Stead and Elizabeth; mother-in-law Wendy Mercer; sister Andrea (Lee Boswell); brother-in-law Aaron Mercer (Vanessa); nieces Ellie Mercer and Haylee Boswell; aunts Marie Armstrong (Frank), Carmelita Porter (Stuart), Clare Murphy, and Tina Murphy; uncles Ted Murphy (Doris) and Harry Crawford (Lillian); and a large circle of cousins, family, colleagues and friends.

Always in search of knowledge and information, Michael completed a B. Sc at Memorial University in 1999, an M. Ed at the University of New Brunswick in 2006, and an MBA at the Royal Military College of Canada in 2018. He worked in information technology and project management with several organizations during his career, and particularly enjoyed business travel, if only for the airline status. Michael never shied away from helping out, and often volunteered his time to assist any community organization in which he was involved – there are too many to list.

His sense of dedication and loyalty was fostered through his involvement with Air Cadets and the Cadet movement. Major Crawford was initially involved as an air cadet with 880 and rose through ranks holding various positions, including Commanding Officer of 510 Lions RCACS. He continued his involvement most recently with the Newfoundland and Labrador Area Office. He was appointed as an Aide-de-Camp serving the past three Lieutenant Governors of Newfoundland and Labrador, a role in which he took great pride and enjoyment.
