


News from the Pews - Sunday, June 23rd, 2024

Rev. David's Message



"Remember the Sabbath day, to keep it holy. Six days you shall labor, and do all your work, but the seventh day is the Sabbath of the LORD your God. In it you shall not do any work, you, or your son, or your daughter, your male servant, or your female servant, or your livestock, or the sojourner who is within your gates. For in six days the LORD made heaven and earth, the sea, and all that is in them, and rested on the seventh day. Therefore the LORD blessed the Sabbath day and made it holy."

I think that it is very important for us, as Christians, to know how to talk to people about our faith and the practices it demands of us, even if they aren't Christian themselves. Over the last few months, the importance of the Sabbath has been growing in my mind, and although it may seem like a profoundly faith-based concept, it is something that I think we can share with everyone in our lives.

Jesus was constantly struggling with people who wanted to make checklists for how to properly "do" Sabbath. For them, it was rules about what actions were allowed, and they watched Jesus closely to judge him for healing on the Sabbath day (as if God would ever be opposed to healing!) For many of us, there is a tradition of not shopping on Sundays, or having a meal with family, or something else.

But really, Sabbath is about rest. Not rules, but the concept. It is permission to set down your burdens and enjoy what God has given you in the day. What that means varies: For one person, helping at the food bank is work and should be avoided when participating in a Sabbath. For another, the same actions are not something they would consider work, and they should not be denied.

Remind those around you that they are worth a break, that life is given to be enjoyed, and how many of our tasks are not really so desperate as they may seem. Ask them how they rest, and if they succeed at resting.

And you yourselves, take time to do nothing but enjoy the life God has given you and think well of God for what you have received. Truly, that is the best way to keep the Sabbath. That is the rest and worship that make the day holy, and it grows an attitude with the power to change this weary world. That is the rest that so many around us need and crave. Let us leave our burdens to Christ and live lives abundantly full, so that others may see and wonder. May this summer be a blessing to you and those around you. May you find Sabbath rest in this, the most beautiful corner of God's creation. Hallelujah, and Amen!
