# Minister's Message



What are you steeping in? Cut flowers draw from the water they are placed in, and you can do a little science experiment with some food colouring to see this in action. As the plants draw up the water they need, the food colouring is drawn up too, travelling up the stems and through the petals of the flower until, as the water evaporates into the air, the colour is left behind to change the hue of the bloom. A flower drinking red water will become red, a flower drinking blue water will slowly turn blue, and so on. Depending on the type of flower and how much food colouring you use, the effects can start to show up in only a few hours.

Now, unlike flowers, drinking coloured water will not change your skin tone. But in the same way, we are subtly shaped and changed by the streams we drink from. In these days more than ever, each of us is conscious of where we get our news, of whose stories we will listen to and whose we will cast aside. Once a narrative has been poured into our ears, it percolates through our hearts and cannot help but begin to tint us.

So what are you steeping in? Increasingly, I am realizing the importance for us, as Christians, to turn to the Bible to answer this question. The narratives of scripture are powerful and unexpected, proclaiming a world that is good, demanding love for enemies, and showing forgiveness as the true path to fulness of life. As Christians, we ought to be marinating in the scriptures, so that they come to infuse us. To do this, we have to really trust in the messages of the Bible and see their value, and to do that, we have to get to know them.

The Bible is not really written like a rule book. It is also not written as a theological essay. So much of it is narrative and poetry, stories and songs given to be told and retold and steeped in until they leap to our mind and colour how we see the world and our place in it.

In 2025, St. David's will be celebrating our 250th year of worshipping together as a congregation. The congregation has changed, the building has changed, the style of worship has changed, the English language has changed, which church we are a part of has changed. We are not connected to the St. David's of 250 years ago in many meaningful ways at all, save by the continuing story, the narrative, that defines who we are and how we got here, and that narrative matters enough that we claim it for our identity.

In the coming year, my hope is to focus on the grand narrative of the Bible, a unified story that leads to Jesus. I aim to remind you, or convince you, to claim it as your identity. We will steep together in the message of scripture, and discover ways that it predicts and guides the story of our lives, if we have the wisdom to learn.

So what are you steeping in? What stories do you use to understand the joys and the struggles of this life? Do you see random chance, or karma, or natural consequences behind it all, or can you believe there is a stronger hand working for good in this world? The stories we tell ourselves matter, we draw them up and breathe them out, and they leave a mark on us as clearly as dye colours the petals of a flower.

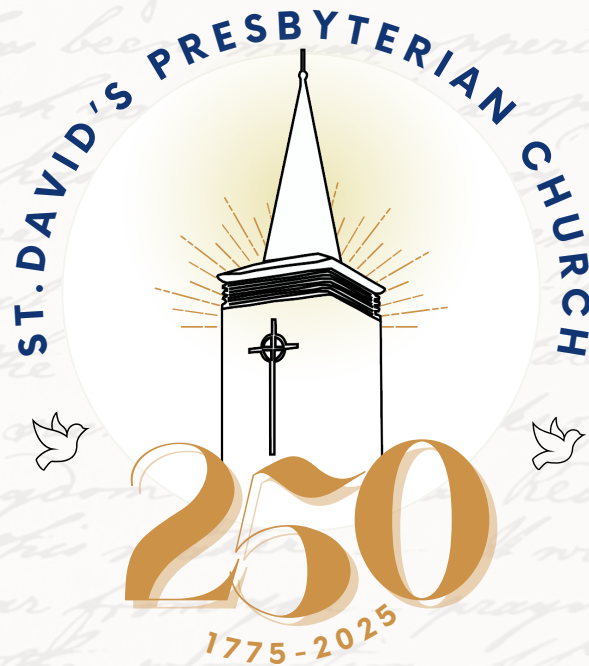
May you be marked by the colours of Christ, shining with grace, mercy, compassion and love. May faith grow and strengthen in you, so that when you hear the stories of those who suffer, you see and value them as Christ who suffered. When you have more than enough, may the warnings of the prophets ring in your ears and urge you to righteousness in your community. When you are sad, may the cries of the Psalms assure you that you are far from abandoned or alone. May you be steeped in the Love of God, for that is a spring of water that will never run dry, and as you draw it up over and over and over again, it will fill you to abundant life.

# Treasurer's Report

We are now almost a month into the new “church year”, this being written on September 25th . The various groups have started their fall and winter schedule. Welcome back!

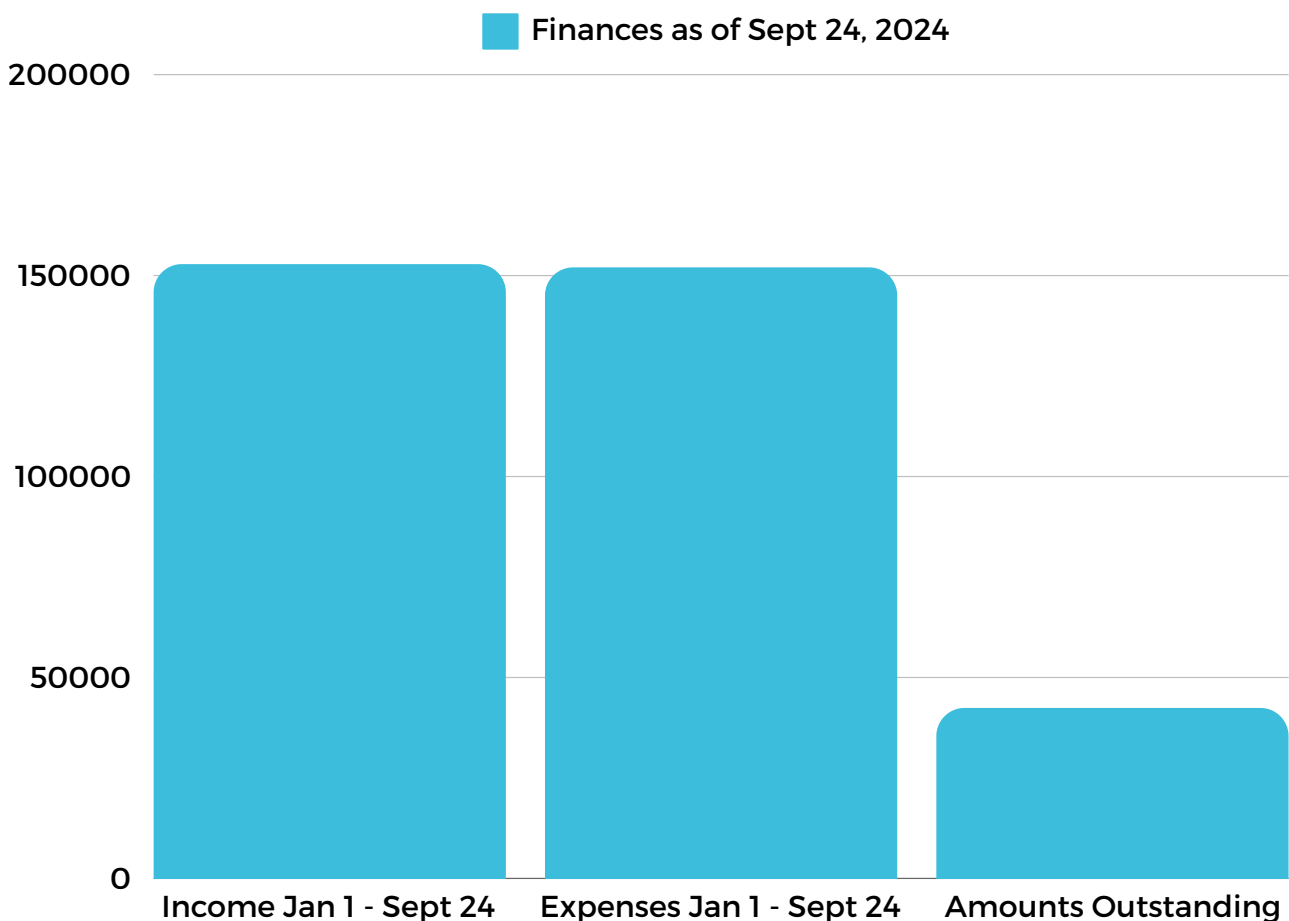
We began the year with a small surplus and as treasurer I keep a lid on our finances as can be seen from:

Expenses Jan 1 – Sep 24: \$152,039.14

Income Jan 1 – Sep 24: \$152,850.19

We currently have \$9,293.67 in our current account and by Oct 1st I will have paid out \$9,592.52 to our employees, contractors, and local business entities.

This chart shows the income, expenses and outstanding amounts currently due.





## **We owe \$42,419.60 to various groups and companies;**

the largest share by far being the Presbyterian Church in Canada and its various entities. I continue to pay what I can, when I can. The Board and Session are aware of these numbers and support me.

I do have expectations of some income due within a short period of time and am fully aware that **a majority of our annual income, well over 20%, occurs in the last six weeks or so of the year. If you are able to support our church, please do so.**

Thank you to all who are continuing to donate to your church through your envelopes on Sunday mornings, e-transfers, or through your monthly PAD contributions. My thanks go out to elders and friends who happily and gladly pick-up envelopes from those not able to get out and about.

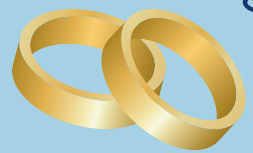

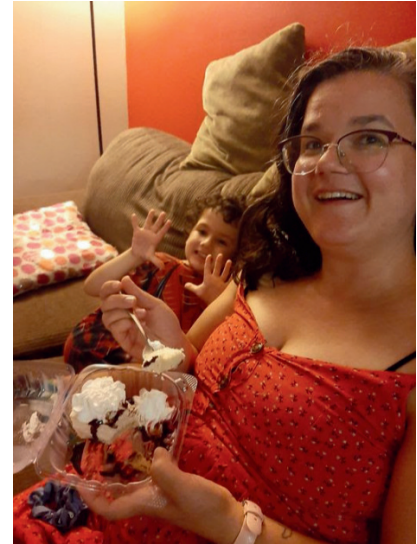

### Gaza Ceasefire Pilgrimage in Ottawa



On May 22, 2024, Presbyterians from across the country gathered in Ottawa for a historic event. The group gathered in a tent park for prayer and to address the UN. #### Gaza Ceasefire Pilgrimage and Calls to Action

The following Calls to Action were brought to parliament in Ottawa as part of the Gaza Ceasefire Pilgrimage. They can be found under the heading of Representative and Representative group members who participated in the event.

- An enduring and sustained ceasefire
- Immediate flow of humanitarian aid, including food, water, fuel, and shelter
- Release of all captives
- End of price gouging in Israel
- Ending occupation in a just peace can begin

Canada has a strong public basis to take leadership in these areas, and there is more that Canada can and should do. Canada can engage the international community to increase the pressure on Israel to end the occupation and to ensure that the national humanitarian and international human rights laws must be respected.

Canada should highlight how international rules require Israel to respect the provisions of the International Court of Justice, which calls for a ceasefire and urgent safe passage of humanitarian aid. Canada should also highlight how international law requires Israel to avoid military attacks on military targets with intent to avoid completely or limit the impact of the attacks. The need for a ceasefire is not negotiable, but it does not mean that an effective ceasefire would only be achieved through a formal agreement. 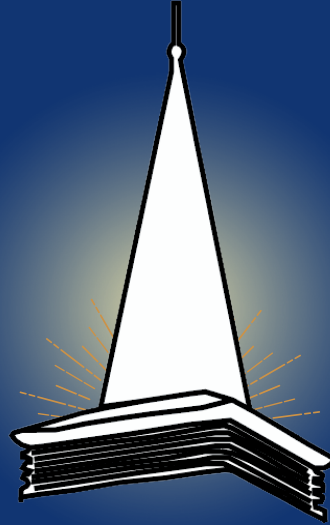
