Minister's Message



This past week, one of my kids' favourite television personalities, Emily Calandrelli, went to space. She's well known for her popular Netflix science show called "Emily's Wonder Lab" which ran for only one season, but has her performing science experiments together with a group of kids. She teaches in a way that engages and inspires children to love learning and experimenting, and reminds me a bit of "Bill Nye the Science Guy". She brought seeds up to space with her, to distribute for free to children after returning, as well as a USB flash drive full of the written hopes and dreams of children who had written to her, lifting them up to the stars as an inspiration for them. She was also the 100th woman in space, a momentous achievement to be sure. What a great story it is for my kids to remember that the sky isn't the limit.

Minister's Message

But the first headline I read about it was "Emily Calandrelli, 100th woman in space, refuses to bow to 'small men on the internet'". In less than a day, the article reported, "'hoards of men' online sexualized her raw and emotional response" in the video of her wondrous experience, and she spent her plane ride home in tears. She is very good at keeping the focus on the inspiration of the event, but I'd be lying if I didn't say that I am disappointed in humanity. The world is just not ready for such a show of goodness and wonder and awe and love. The small will misinterpret it, mock it, and fail to understand it.

This month, we celebrate Christmas, when God came to live a human life among us. We remember that His arrival was marked by human failure; he was born under an oppressive regime with the swords of Herod's soldiers at his neck. He was born in a stable, because no-one would make room for him. He was born to nobodies from nowhere, in an area roiled in human conflict still to this day. They were not ready for Him, and perhaps neither are we.

But God doesn't wait for us to be ready to love us. The world was not ready, and Mary, as a first time Mother, must have felt unready as well for the birth of her son. But as anyone who has given birth knows, it doesn't really matter if you're ready or not once the baby starts coming. No birth waits for you to be ready.

In the same way we celebrate Christmas with hope, because we believe that God's love is coming to the world with all the inescapable push of a child being born. We may not be ready, we may feel the birthing pains and face a world full of misinterpretation and mockery, but the world did not stop God's mission through Christ and it will not stop our mission today.

Minister's Message

In the coming year, St. David's will be reflecting on 250 years as a congregation in St. John's. In many ways, things have changed in that time. Reflecting back, this congregation's path has never been an easy one, and as we struggle to find a sustainable path forwards there is reassurance in that realization. But this is also a chance to recognize the profound changes that our church has come through and ask ourselves how we are called to change to prepare for the coming future.





St. David's displays a strong community spirit right here, as evidenced by the time and effort people take to help out with, and for, our various groups. This can be anything from those who make soup or desserts for the bridge parties, to the person who joyfully measures the balls and their distances from the "jack" during the Good Companions carpet bowling.

I'd certainly like to acknowledge the support we have received this year from your donations to this church. These allow us to do everything from keeping the heat up and the lights on, enabling us to support our various groups – Sunday School, Bible Study, Good Companions, the weekly pickleball sessions, the WA and the AMS. Memorial Tree Dedication - November 3, 2024

Both families developed a great friendship since moving to the Province back in the 1960's and the close family ties continued with both Christina and Hugh joining the Memorial Tree together.

Their leaves serve as a tribute and remembrance to all the beautiful memories we have of them as part of our Church family.

From April and Family...

On behalf of our family, I would like to thank Janet Calver and Steve Bruneau for helping us complete this memorial leaf. When Mom an Dad immigrated from Scotland in 1965, St. David's became their community. Mom was involved with the WA in the 1970's, joined the Board of Managers in the '80's and helped in any way she could. Dad joined the Board of Managers later in the 90's and later became an Elder. His engineering and Mr. Fix it knowledge came in handy many times, I'm sure.

The closest friendship bond created through St. David's was the one with Christina and Norman Baird. Their family became our family as many summer holidays and Christmas Days were spent together for over 20 plus years.

In 1964, Dad and Theresa were married her at St. David's with Norman as his best man and Christina creating the beautiful flowers.

To lose both our Auntie Chris and Dad in the same year has been most difficult. So, to have them both join the memorial tree together means a great deal.

When we were looking at the memory tree to decide on the leaf for Dad, we were reminded of all the many friends who were so close to our families. Zena Bleeker, Peter and Elizabeth Berghuis, Gay Laaning, The Kieftes, the Grays, just to name a few. I thought about how remarkable it is to have such a history full of friendships documented in such a beautiful way. These are the true roots of St. David's. Legacies of families, memories and joy. Thanks you for the Bruneau Family for creating this beautiful tree of memories so the wonderful history of our church can be seen for all the families who join our congregation.

From Ken and Family...

Thanks for the opportunity to say a few words today about Mom as we dedicate a leaf to her memory on the Memorial Tree. This tree is special, as it brings to life the history of the St. David's Church community.

Mom's faith was steadfast – she lived her life as a faithful Christian to the best of her ability, which kept her grounded. Our family connected with St. David's Church when we came to Canada in 1968. Many of my childhood memories are of family times enjoyed at St. David's congregational events through the years. Mom made sure that the church remained a central element of our upbringing. To this day, we have many life-long friendships from the St. David's community that have withstood the ravages of time and distance – especially the Cumming family and the Gray family.

Mom was an active member of the congregational community when she lived in Canada. Over the years, she thoroughly enjoyed her time singing as a member of the church choir; helping out with all the Women's Auxiliary and other church events whenever called upon; organizing and helping to make the beautiful Christmas banners (which are still hung every Christmas time) and some of the other banners adorning the church on many occasions.

Upon her recent return to Canada in 2018, she immediately reconnected with St. David's and again became a semi-regular attendee at Sunday services. She loved attending the Thursday Good Companions group – especially the bowling. By her own accounts to us, she wasn't that good but she always had a smile on her face after attending. And she especially appreciated her friendships with Sheena Findlay and Kay Scott.

She now rests side by side with my Dad on the tree, among their many dear friends. I would like to thank the Reverend David Sturtevant and the Council of Elders for bestowing this honor on Mom. I would also like to thank Jane Steneker for reaching out to us about this opportunity.
