Minister's Message



Jesus said "The eye is the lamp of the body; so then, if your eye is wholesome, your whole body will be full of light. But if your eye is bad, your whole body will be full of darkness. So if the light that is in you is darkness, how great is the darkness!" (Matthew 6:22-23)

You may have seen charms like the one in the picture here, known as a "Hamsa". Common in the middle east and parts of northern Africa, it is traditionally used as a protection against the "Evil Eye", made of glass, woven into fabric, or painted on. The Evil Eye is a curse that is born from a jealous look, applied by the act of gazing, an ill intent that sticks to and curses the unwitting recipient. In the passage from Matthew above, we see that Jesus also taught about the dangers of an evil eye.

In our modern scientific understanding, we think of eyes as receivers, taking in light particles that come in through the lens, and allowing us to see based on what comes into them. In the ancient understanding, the technology wasn't there to understand photons or even the complex structures of the eye, and so they came to different conclusions. To the ancients, eyes didn't take things in, they put things out.

For them, attention and focus go out from the eyes to rest on various things. The eyes are like a lamp that shines with whatever is on the inside. If you are full of goodness and light, it goes out to bless the world. If you are dark inside, that darkness is in your gaze, clinging to all you see and ruining it, cursing those you see.

What do your eyes put out? Do you look at others with charity, compassion, and with the benefit of the doubt? In recent news, the President of the United States has expressed continued views that the US is being "taken advantage of" by trading partners, looking at trade deals he himself brokered with new eyes. As we face elections of our own in this upcoming year, doubtless attempts will be made to have us turn bad eyes against political opponents instead of wholesome ones. If you can control how people see things, you can control them.

If the world seems dark, remember that our eyes are the lamp of our body. How we look at things does, in fact, change the world. Take responsibility for what you are putting out into the world, even with your eyes, and you will reap the rewards that Jesus promises: if your eye is right, so the rest will be too.

This month, you will be filled with light by the lamp of your body. When Jesus speaks, he says the eye comes first and fills the body with whatever is filling the eye. May God save you from the Evil Eye, and most importantly may He keep it from finding a home in your own head! May you make every effort to look on the world and your own situation with the love, grace, thankfulness and joy that God's Spirit brings.


Take charge of your eye, and the darkness will never overcome you.


Thursday, April 24th 2:30 pm - 3:30 pm The Rooms Theatre

From the rugged barrens of 18th-century St. John's to the welcoming doors of St. David's Presbyterian Church today, the story of this congregation is one of resilience, faith, and community. Join us as we embark on a journey through time, following the Dissenters' Path through the streets of St. John's that traces the evolution of the congregation from its founding in 1775 to the present day.

This engaging presentation will feature insights from Dr. Steve Bruneau, PhD, P.Eng., along with members of the congregation's original founding families, who will share personal and historical perspectives on the congregation's rich legacy.

Using historical maps, archival records, and personal accounts, they will explore the key locations that shaped the congregation's history—from its earliest gatherings in the barracks of Fort William to the construction of the Stone Chapel, the devastating fires of 1892, and the eventual establishment of St. David's Presbyterian Church. Attendees will also have the rare opportunity to view archival records in person, including original documents and artifacts that bring the congregation's history to life.

Join us for a fascinating glimpse into the enduring spirit of St. David's, and the deep roots of religious dissent in Newfoundlandand while seeing 250 years of history up close. After all, it's not everyday you turn 250 years old.



Treasurer's Report

St. David's does really well financially as we near the end of any calendar year. Now at the beginning of March our pattern remains consistent, which shows us falling behind. We have enough income to meet some commitments, but not all, meaning choices are made of who and when to pay.

For 2025, we again have a projected deficit. A meeting to discuss the 2025 budget with the combined Board and Session was set for Saturday Feb 7th. Four people accepted the invitation and so, the meeting was cancelled. Subsequently, I sent out copies of the latest budget to all those invited. One person reviewed the budget asking several questions and suggesting some tweaks. One person emailed asking if there was to be another in-person meeting.

Preparations for the upcoming Annual Congregational Meeting (ACM) have begun. A date has been suggested by the Board for Session's agreement. The persons in church leadership and our church groups have described their activities over the past year. The Annual Report for 2024 including the budget for 2025 will be prepared and presented to the members of the congregation in time for the ACM.

I am delighted to report that we have new members for the Board of Managers, new people are still joining and more are invited to join. As we embark on our 250th Anniversary, please reflect on what St. David's means to you and your family, now, and going forward into the future. Our future depends on you and everything you bring to our congregation. As treasurer, I do appreciate your generosity. I hope that you continue to support St. David's in many ways and as best you can.

Condolences Mary Holloway




Condolences to the Holloway and Hudson families on the unexpected passing of Mary Holloway on January 26, 2025.






Knitter's Group - Welcomes a New Member!

Lemon Squares (Paul Rice)

Paul Rice has become a great friend to many here at St. David's. Paul is a great supporter of many events here at the Church. One of his favourites we believe is our Good Companions Group that meets every Thursday afternoon for carpet bowling and friendly bridge. Paul has been delighting our Good Companions with his baking skills – especially the "sweet treats" that he bakes for their "tea/coffee break"! His baking has become legendary so much so that every now and then we'll print one of his favourite recipes. This week it's his Lemon Squares. Thanks Paul for sharing and for your gifts of baking and friendship!

Lemon Squares
I find that one medium-sized lemon is enough.

Cut together as if making piecrust: ½ cup butter ¼ cup icing sugar 1 cup flour ½ salt



Spread and pat onto the bottom of an 8 or 9 "pan [I use parchment paper in the pan because it makes getting them squares out of the pan to cut easier.] Bake 20 minutes at 350 degrees F.

Mix together:
2 eggs, slightly beaten
1 cup white sugar
2½ tbs. flour
3 tbs. lemon juice
1 tbs. grated lemon rind (or to taste)

Pour mixed wet ingredients over the baked base and return to over for 20 to 25 minutes at 350 degrees F. [I find that 20 minutes is usually long enough.]





Rock Climbing Adventures

For those of you who did not watch the CBC Land and Sea episode entitled "Land & Sea: Rock Climbing Rapture on the Cliffs of Newfoundland", we encourage you to check it out. You'll hear and see the story of Daniel Alocoque, an expert rock climber along with some of his friends who share his passion. One of those friends is David Bruneau, who many of you know. Check out their climb of El Capitan, a vertical rock formation in Yosemite National Park. At 3000 feet from base to summit along its tallest face, it's a world famous location for climbing.
