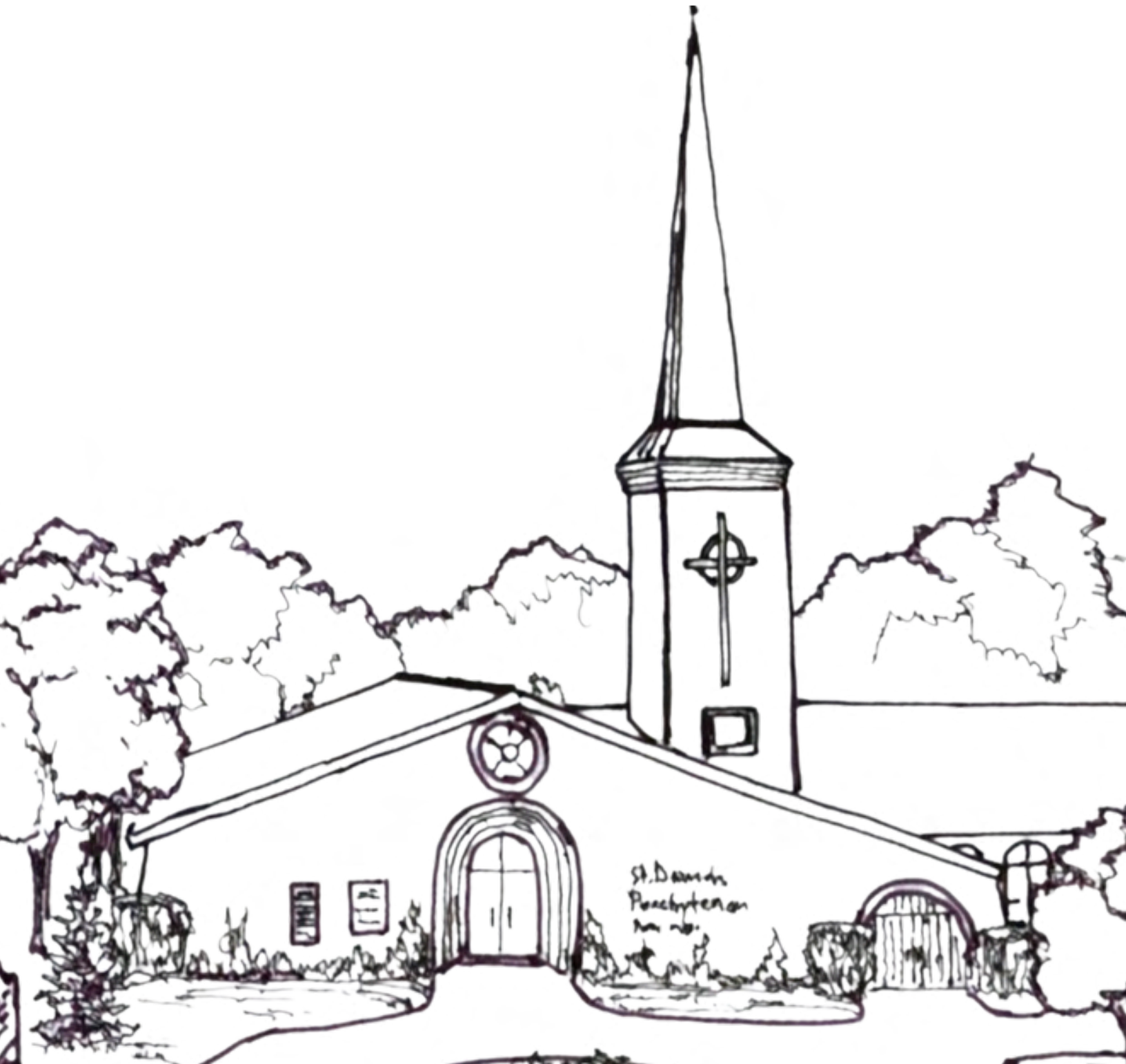

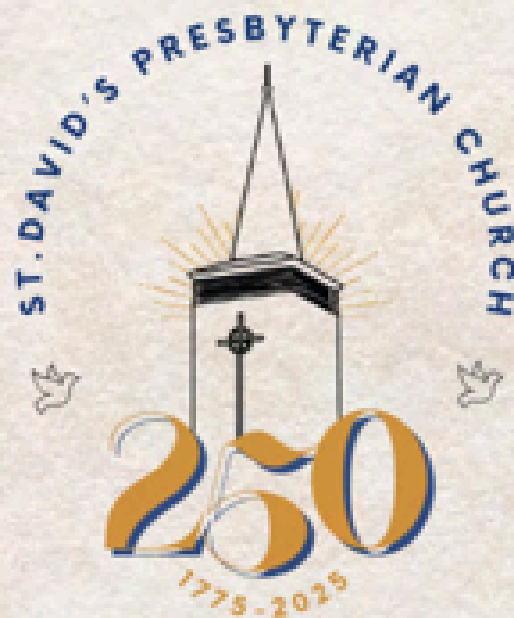

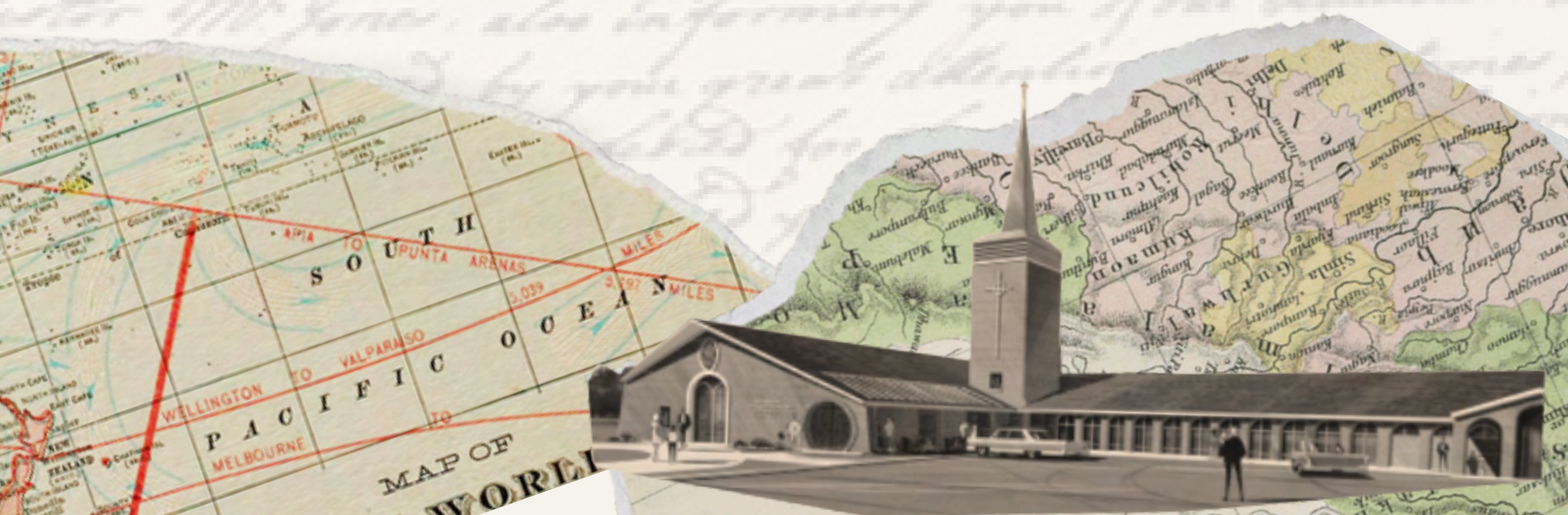

Dissenters Path

Invitation to walk the “Dissenter’s Path” guided tour on

The “Dissenters Path” is an interpreted walk that traces the
250-year history of the Congregation today known at
St.David’s Presbyterian Church. The walk touches on the
places and events that shaped the church from its origins in
the 1770’s through to its present day. The walk will take
the “Main Path” and “Return Loop” (as seen on the map)
which is a total of 5km taking around 2+ hours.

Memorial Tree Dedication – On Sunday, September 30th, the Ellis Family gathered to dedicate a leaf on our Memorial Tree in honour of John Ellis. His son, Neil, gave a tribute in his father's honour...

My father's journey began in 1962, when he sailed from Liverpool to Newfoundland. It was on that boat that he met my mother—an encounter that would change both of their lives. A year later, in 1963, he immigrated here, and soon after they were married at St. Matthew's Church in Grand Falls.

From the beginning, he poured his energy into both family and community. At St. David's Church, he helped establish the first Beaver Colony with Mrs. Carmichael, opening doors for young people through the Scouting movement. He also served as a Venturer leader and gave three years of dedicated service on the Board of Managers.

He was more than a member of the community—he was a builder of it. His faith, his service, and his leadership leave a legacy that still guides us today.

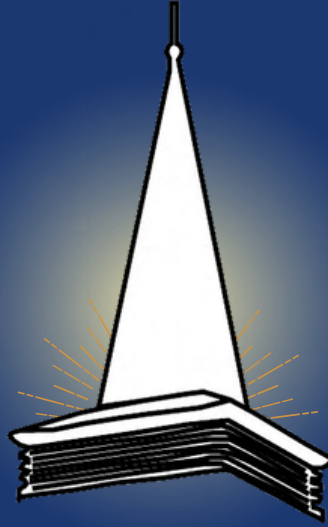
