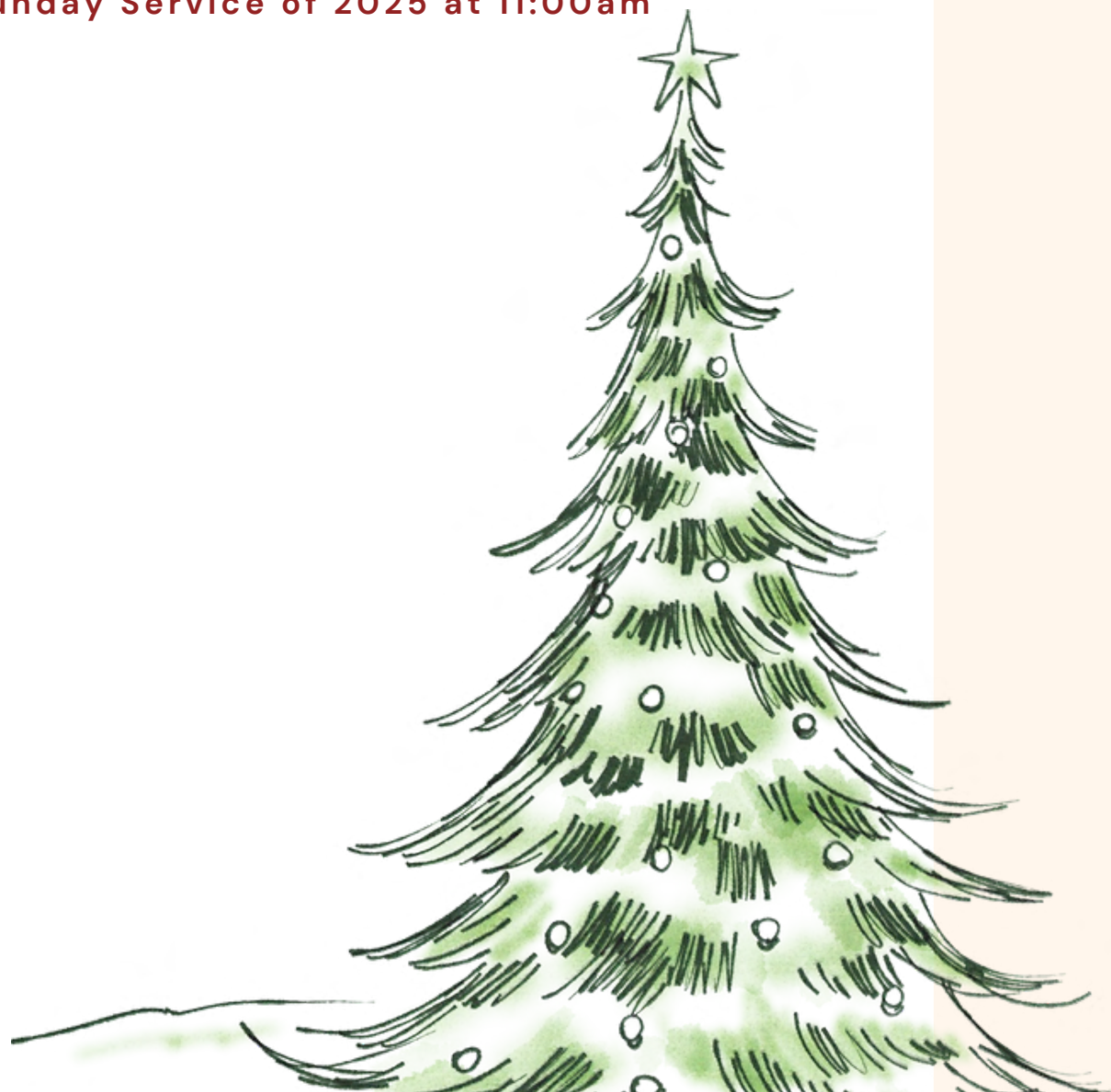

Treasurer's Report

This is a special version of the treasurer's message. I'd like to talk a bit about various scams that you need to be aware of and what you can do. St. David's is not immune to scammers. A while back, a scammer used a gmail account under our minister's name and sent messages to at least one person in Nova Scotia (that we know about) asking for gift or grocery cards.

How did this happen? Rev. Sturtevant had not used his own gmail address for more than two years. When your gmail account is about to go dormant, gmail sends a message to the backup address associated with that account. St. David's did get a message from gmail saying the address was going to be inactivated. We were lax and did not catch the problem in time. The result was that Rev. Sturtevant's gmail account was picked up by a scammer who then proceeded to send off notes asking for gift cards.

The second scam happened just last week. A renter sent us an email saying a cheque would be dropped off to us Friday. What our renter didn't know at the time, was that his email had been hacked.

The scammer saw the email sent to St. David's and then took advantage. The scammer replied to our renter using an extremely good "look-alike St. David's address" and convinced our renter to use that email for his e-transfer. His money soon disappeared.

These scams are very convincing. Always be alert and be careful. Please take pause to recognize when weird things happen, when we're asked to use unusual emails or banking information. Ask yourself is this really from St. David's?

What I would like to stress is:

St. David's will always accept cheques.

We will always accept e-transfers with auto deposit, which are the regular donation and concert payment options (no passwords required) at either:

stdavidsnfld@gmail.com or musicinthehall250@gmail.com

*If you get an email that does not seem quite right - does not sound like Heather, has spelling or grammar mistakes, is stiff, or has language issues - **THEN IT IS PROBABLY NOT FROM HEATHER.** You can always check first.*

I'd also like to mention that Christmas is just around the corner and we normally do well in the last six to eight weeks of the year. I should mention finances. Our 250th anniversary year is like many others in our long history. We pay all our local bills including our first snow-clearing invoice. We continue to owe money to the Presbyterian Church of Canada. Those commitments will be met by year's end.

St. David's congregation has waxed and waned for over two hundred and fifty years. We are a group of diverse people who have come together to form a community of individuals who consider this their home church. This year please reflect on what St. David's means to you and your family, now, going forward, and into the future. Our future depends on you and everything you bring to our congregation. As Treasurer, I do appreciate your generosity. I hope that you continue to support St. David's in many ways and as best you can.

Paul Rice Visits York, England

A few weeks ago, Paul Rice took a lovely trip to the UK and while there, visited York, one of his favourite places. Below is Paul's note and some pictures from his trip. Thank-you for sharing, Paul!

During my recent trip to the UK, I was lucky to spend time in the wonderful city of York. I was also fortunate to visit Fountains Abbey which is located outside of Ripon. The ruins of this monastic abbey are the largest in Britain and are wonderfully impressive. The abbey was founded in 1132 by thirteen Benedictine monks from York who sought a simpler life in the countryside. They later became a part of the Cistercian order. As the abbey became wealthy, the abbey buildings grew in size and grandeur. Following the dissolution of the monasteries in 1539 by Henry VIII, the buildings passed into private hands and are today located on the grounds of the Studley Royal Water Park. To do justice to this huge estate, you need a day to see everything, but it is certainly worth the visit.

Simms Street Fire – Sarah Bassler’s Letter and a Recent Update

The devastating fire that destroyed an apartment building on Simms Street several weeks ago, touched the hearts of many, including Sarah Bassler and her family, who live in the neighbourhood and have developed close friendships with many of the residents. Below is Sarah’s personal letter to the congregation:

Hello St. David’s Family,

I wanted to let you know about a devastating incident in our neighbourhood two nights ago. A terrible fire engulfed the Hillcrest Apartment Building on Simms St. Thankfully nobody was hurt but all the families have been displaced and the building is totally destroyed. In total, 23 children under the age of 13 (including 11 under 7) and their parents (9 women and 8 men) have been affected.

Fundraiser: A fundraiser to help the families get back on their feet is being coordinated by Connections for Seniors. Donations can be made through their website: <https://www.connectionsforseniors.ca/> Click “Make a Donation” and enter “Fire Survivors” in the comment field. All donors will receive a tax receipt.

Donations of clothing, toiletries, blankets, grocery store gift cards, non-perishable food, diapers, toys, etc. can be dropped off to 6 Patrick Street (Connections for Seniors building).

Regarding sizing – there are four 12-13 yr old girls, three 10-11 yr old boys, multiple 5-7 yr old girls and boys, two toddlers under 2 yrs old, and the rest of the little ones are 2-4 yrs old.

Adopt-a-Family: Most of the families are new Canadians who came to Newfoundland as refugees in the past 1-3 years and have made their homes in our community. I am friends with several of them and help them with things like practicing English, registering their kids for sports, job hunting, resume prep, looking for apartments, shopping for school supplies, making a run to the grocery store, understanding their mail, etc. I was wondering if there may be others in the church community who would be interested in doing the same.

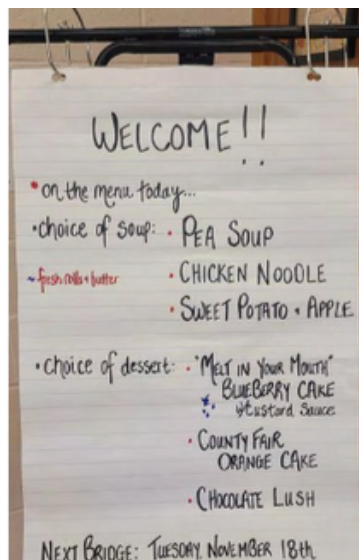

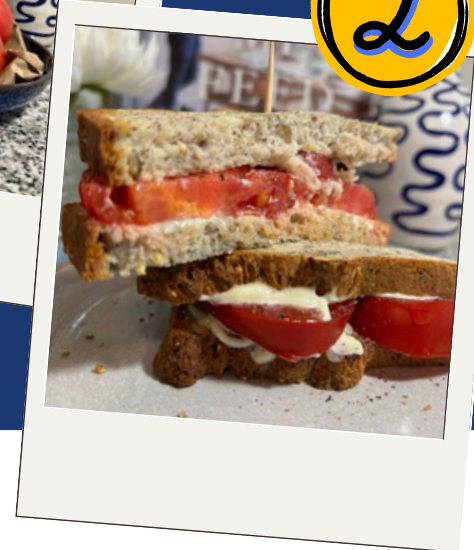

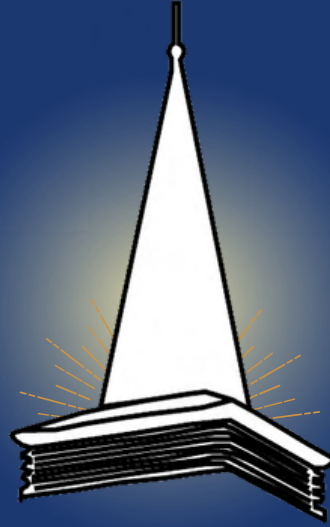
